The next step is the Ministry Site Study. One synod staff member and two Support to Ministry members lead a congregational meeting. This study offers the opportunity for church members to share their thoughts on CLF and its ministry and what they hope to see in our new pastor. This study has not yet been scheduled. Love is Greater...

One of my favorite on-line stores is *Old Lutheran* (www.oldlutheran.com). They have a lot of fun and funny stuff. Recently, they came out with a number of products (t-shirts, bumper stickers, mugs, signs) with the theme of **Love is Greater**. The t-shirt I want to get is a simple grey in color. Love and the mathematical "greater than" sign are in red. The words on the other side of that math symbol are all in black. And so it reads like this...

Love is Greater than ...

Grief. History. Hopelessness. Anger. Hate. Hunger. Jealousy. Shame. Money. Despair. Defensiveness. Status. Fear. Tradition.

Let's be honest. We live in a world consumed with hate. We are perpetrators of that hate. This is not a political statement. This is a statement about our humanity. We have entirely lost sight of Jesus' words. In fact, our own actions indicate that we don't even believe them anymore. "Jesus said – 'You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your mind.' This is the greatest and first commandment. And a second is like it: 'You shall love your neighbor as yourself.'" (Matthew 22:37-39)

Wow. You will notice that Jesus does not give any qualifiers in these commandments. He does <u>not</u> link loving God or our neighbor to agreeing with each other or skin color or language or religion or politics or gender or economics. Jesus commands our love. Maybe that is what we really have trouble with. We are a people who hate to be told what to do. We pride ourselves on our individualism. And once again, the Christian faith revealed to us through the words of Jesus in scripture (not what televangelists preach or the media reports) says clearly – without a doubt – that love happens in community – among our neighbors and with our God. Doing love is our responsibility – our mission – as followers of Jesus.

So, it is ironic to me that we are now in February – the month when love is sold by Hallmark, candy companies, florists and jewelers. Because when we do talk about love – we find ourselves loving everything with equal zeal. We love America, football, chocolate along with our mothers, husbands, children and pets. But, is that the love which Jesus commands?

I am just like you. I was pretty clueless about what love even looked like. I remember being genuinely surprised to discover that my parents loved each other even fifty years after their wedding day. I remember them loudly disagreeing with each other as I was growing up. It didn't seem like love to me. I was sure that love had more to do with flowers, wine and laughter – all in slow motion. And, sometimes it was – but most of the time – not so much.

I learned to understand love when I watched my father as my mother slip deeper into Alzheimer's. Many times it wasn't fun to watch. But, my father took seriously the promises he had made so very long ago. He was relentless in his commitment to my mother. He insisted that he would care for her and keep her at home as long as possible. He would hold her hand and tease her out of her dark moods. He kept going even on those days that she wasn't quite sure who he was. Many days were not go good days, but my father stuck with it. That's when I began to realize that in reality love is hard work, commitment and the keeping of promises.

And that's what we have to work towards. Fortunately we have an example of that. God's relationship with us is a lot like that. God is relentless in his commitment to us. God takes seriously those promises He made at our baptisms. And, despite our dark moods, our selfishness, our continual screw-ups, God perseveres. God loves us despite ourselves. God loves us even when we refuse or are unable to love Him in return. God never gives up on us.

All I can say at a time like this – where it seems that hate is greater than love in our world – thank God for God's enduring grace. May we all come to know the unyielding power of God's love in our own lives and then turn towards the neighbors all around us with that kind of love. And friends, it's going to take a lot of hard work and commitment. We are going to have to do exactly the opposite of what the world tells us to do. Jesus commands it.

Okay – I am off to put in my order for my own **Love is Greater** t- shirt now.....

What is Obsessive/ Compulsive Disorder? This is a form of Mental Illness not often talked about except in jest. This can make life very difficult for the person as well as those in their life. Almost every action throughout has to be calculated & a system followed by routine. The person may need to check the locks on their door 4-6 times to be certain they locked the door. Every day of the week may have to be dedicated to certain activities. They may have difficulty in strange places as they are out of their comfort zone. These are just a few examples. Their lives become entangled with rituals that dictate how they must live. Yes, there is hope with the proper treatment such as talk therapy, behavioral therapy and medication. Our next NAMI (National Alliance on Mental Illness) meeting is on February 13th. They are held on the third Wednesday of each month at the Library meeting room in the back from 6:00-7:00 PM. 2017 Mission Plan/Budget—The 2017 Budget was presented by Lonnie Hosman. He explained that our income for 2016 was \$23,000 less than budgeted and was \$39,000 less than 2015 and \$95,000 less from 2014. Changes for 2017 include: 1.5% salary increases; total mission support will remain the same as 2016 but adding \$2,000 for Synod Capital Appeal. The projected expenses for 2017 are \$23,000 less than 2016—this is due to the fact that we will not have a full time pastor next year. The one-time money that is leftover from the 2016 budget will not be needed until 2018 when we do have a full time pastor. **MSC** to approve the 2017 Mission Plan/Budget.

Old Business:

- **Eagle Scout Projects & Thank You's**—Eagle Scout projects of landscaping & playground equipment were completed in 2015. There were none done in 2016.
- SD Synod Capital Campaign—this is to support seminary debt reduction and new church start-ups. We will do something with this in March during Lent.
- Sale of Custer Highlands Property—We agreed to accept \$14,000 minus fees. We received \$11,510 after the fees were deducted.

New Business:

- Endowment Committee—the committee recommended to give the Rap Group \$6,500 for their Germany trip. MSC

 Call Committee—Kim Canete spoke about the processes involved. The Ministry Site Profile has been completed and submitted to the Synod. They have been meeting with committees and small groups to ask them the Ministry Site Study guestions. Next step is to schedule the study with the Synod.
- **Flooring Committee**—Mickey Schlecht spoke on the progress of the flooring. To date, we have raised \$19,200.66 and spent \$8,107.53 leaving a balance of \$11,093.13 for phase 2.
- CLF Energy Plan—Carol Laverick spoke about our lighting project "Let Your Light Shine" which was held last year during Lent and will be again this year during Lent.
- **Financial Secretary**—we will need someone to replace Karen Schleining as Financial Secretary by summer as she is moving to Iowa in June.

Installation of new council members and officers was held.

Council Minutes - January 17, 2017

Treasurer's Report — Lisa reviewed the treasurer's report, members discussed. A motion was made to accept Lisa's report as presented with a clarification on the net income amount, it was seconded and carried. *Unfinished Business:*

- ^a **Memorial List** members discussed.
- ^a Thrivent Choice January amount \$0.00 / \$0.00
- ^a **Flooring Replacement Update** Members discussed a concern voiced about the sound with use of tile in the fellowship hall. Yvonne said that the committee had the same concerns but they were reassured that the new flooring with be sound dampening. Flooring Fund Status– Total given \$18,399.01 / Paid \$8,107.53 / Balance \$10,291.48.
- 2017/2018 Proposed Mission Plan (Budget) Lisa shared the most updated budget after the budget forum on Sunday, members discussed. An addition was made to include a line in the budget for liturgical arts under worship, line 71. This will not have any money associated with it this year but will be something we will re-address in the future. Members discussed a concern voiced at the forum about including the parsonage in the budget. Members discussed and will clarify this question in February. The 2017 Budget has estimated offering contributions of \$350,000 and expenses of \$342,364. The outlook to 2018 includes estimated giving of \$350,000, a surplus from 2017 of \$7,636 and \$27,010 of residual one-time funds, and expenses of \$387,661 for an estimated deficit of \$10,651. A motion was made to approve this budget (mission plan) for recommendation to the congregation at the annual meeting January 29th with the addition of the line item liturgical arts and a recommendation to call a full time pastor.
- Energy Update Carol reported that the kitchen lights have been replaced (they will cut the electric costs in half). The fellowship hall lights and motion lights for the Narthex bathrooms have been purchased. Carol reviewed the 2017 energy goals. Members thanked Carol for this stewardship work.
- ^a Fall Stewardship Drive Update Dave reviewed our stewardship drive history. Members discussed.
- Synod Capital Appeal Dave reported that Lonnie has resigned as the liaison for this campaign. We will be holding this appeal during Lent. Dave asked for suggestions or if anyone else is interested in coordinating.
- Nominating Committee Report Terri Herman, Carol Laverick & Michelle Lehman have met. The group has contacted prospective members and should have a full slate for the annual meeting. Outgoing Council Members Terri Herman & Carol Laverick. Outgoing President & VP Dave Thom & Harold Snow. RAP group will nominate a student representative for council in May to replace Liz Mertz.
- ^a Call Committee Update Dave reviewed the call committee's actions. The committee is working to complete the MSP to send to the Bishop's office in preparation for the CLF ministry site visit. After this visit with the congregation, the MSP will be posted for prospective pastors.
- ^a **Annual Meeting** January 29th Members reviewed the agenda and discussed. Carol volunteered to pick up the chicken from Lynn's.
- ^a Leadership Retreat February 11th at Outlaw Ranch starting with breakfast at 8:00 AM. Pat will create an agenda. New council members will be invited by the nominating committee and Pat will invite the committee members.

New Business:

- ^a **Auditing Committee** members discussed possible candidates for this committee. Dave will contact these folks and share the results via email.
- ^a Attendance/Financial Statistics members reviewed the 2016 year report.
- ^a **Endowment** The Endowment committee recommended that an earnings disbursement of (\$7,000 this amount changed to \$6,500 by an email vote of the Endowment committee because the year-end balance was not \$107,000) be given to the RAP group for their Germany trip. A motion was made to approve this disbursement. It was seconded and carried. .


