PASTOR'S PONDERINGS

The energy that comes at the beginning of Spring in a climate where Winter often feels long and cold is contagious! The energy that is in the people of CLF is contagious! As we enter into Holy Week and the Easter season, there are so many Spring activities! As you will see from the calendar there is a lot to keep track of with important dates and times for both worship and fellowship.



Many of you have spoken these words, or similar words, to me quite a few times in the last couple of weeks. "Pastor, we are so glad you are here! But are you pacing yourself?" Each time I am asked I have tried to reassure you that indeed, I am, but there are just so many wonderful things happening at CLF! You may have

Why recycle crayons?

Unfortunately, most crayons end up in landfills. **Crayons are made of paraffin wax, a petroleum by-product that is toxic to our environment.** In the U.S. alone, more than 60 million crayons are discarded each year. That is over 500,000 pounds of waxy sludge that won't decompose for decades. Thankfully, like other oil based products, crayons can be recycled. Even the paper wrappings are recycled by the National Crayon Recycling Program.

The *National Crayon Recycling Program* recycles unwanted, rejected, broken crayons into new crayons through their partnership with *Crazy Crayons*. This keeps thousands of pounds of waxy sludge out of the landfills.



The Storehouse has decided to coordinate this program in Custer. They will collect and pay the shipping costs to the NCRP where crayons are recycled into fun new shapes to be reused again.



WHAT IS HOLY WEEK?

What is Holy Week?

Many people wonder why there are so many worship services before Easter, and it is a good wondering! As Christians many of us call ourselves Easter People. However, if it wasn't for the events leading up to Jesus death, there would be no Easter. We begin Holy Week on Palm Sunday as we hear the story from Matthew's Gospel of Jesus entering into Jerusalem.

Jesus rode into Jerusalem on what we now call Palm Sunday; palm branches, which symbolize triumph or victory, were strewn in Jesus' path, as He rode into the city. He rode into town on a humble donkey, fulfilling the prophecy in Zechariah 9:9: "*Rejoice greatly, Daughter Zion! Shout, Daughter Jerusalem! See, your kings comes to you, righteous and victorious, low and riding on a donkey, on a colt, the foal of a donkey.*" The people welcomed Him, echoing the words of <u>Psalm 118:25-26</u>: "*Lord, save us! Lord, grant us success!" more popularly recognizes as "Hosanna! Hosanna!*" During this service we will be given palm branches to wave as we sing songs and hear the story to remind us of this event in Jesus life. However, Jesus' fame did not last, as people were afraid of his power and of what it meant for the Empire.

On Holy, or Maundy, Thursday, we continue hearing about the last days of Jesus. Jesus was in Jerusalem to celebrate the Passover, the Jewish tradition of remembering when God "passed over" and protected the Jewish people from death. Jesus shares a last supper with his disciples and asks them to continue sharing the meal together knowing that when we do this Jesus is present with those who eat the bread and drink the wine or juice together. As he is teaching him, he also tells them what it means to be his followers and disciples by following what we now call the Greatest Commandment. Maundy comes from the Latin word "mandate" or commandment. Jesus demonstrates his love by washing the feet of his disciples and then says these words: "A new commandment I give to you, that you love one another: just as I have loved you, you are also to love one another." -John 13:34

On Good Friday, we will gather early to walk and read together the Passion Story, the story when Jesus is confronted, accused, brought to trial and crucified. On Friday evening we will have the opportunity to hear the story again. We read this story and remember that when he died Jesus was completely abandoned by all but one of his disciples and his mother, and felt abandoned by God, his Father. Yet, even as he died, he offered forgiveness. We have an opportunity to pray for the ways in which his death has power to take away our own sin.

This year, Outlaw Ranch is hosting an Easter Vigil (see announcement for registration information). The tradition around an Easter Vigil on the Saturday before Easter is a time of meditation, scripture reading and prayer as we wait for the Resurrection of Jesus.

And finally, we come to the empty tomb, where we find that Jesus is not there, he has been raised from the dead! On Easter Sunday we celebrate the mystery and glory of God through the reality that through Christ, death has been conquered and the gates of eternal life have been open! We will have two services here at CLF to celebrate this gift from God, 6:30am and 9:30am. All are welcome!
