



## FROM THE BISHOP'S DESK

Dear Siblings in Christ,

Grace and peace to you in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit! I am inviting you to tune in to our second annual South Dakota Synod Advent Podcast. The title is plain and simple "Shortage." It seems that much of our life these days is determined by what we don't have, whether it is in material, emotional, physical, mental, or spiritual sense. The world is always right at hand to shout at us loud and clear what we are short of, what we are not, and where we miss the mark. The Bible calls these shortcomings sin.

As we wait for more than packages to arrive at our doorstep, as we try yet one more time to pull ourselves up by our bootstraps, as we take a deep breath hoping that tomorrow will be better, I invite you to tune in this Advent season and listen to Tangled Blue's tunes and synod staff's faithful conversations with partners in ministry. And as we arrive every week to listen, we trust that the Holy Spirit will open our ears and hearts to the message of hope-filled abundance so that we are ready to celebrate the birth of our Savior, Jesus the Christ at Christmas time. So, watch and wait with me, as details for our annual Advent podcast are unfolding abundantly in the midst of shortages in the World. Peace be with you!

#### **Rural Ministry Liaison Position**

As the South Dakota Synod, we are committed to journeying together in Christ. This commitment is rooted in Luke 24 where Jesus attentively accompanied the disciples on the road to Emmaus for as long as they needed him. Once their eyes were opened and they discovered that their hearts were burning within them they picked up ministry again and Jesus vanished from their eyes. But as long as their trust was shaken, they felt alone, uncared for, and desperate. Jesus walked with them, listened to them, and taught them. In the same manner, our rural congregations often feel alone, uncared for, shaken and desperate. If our mission is to accompany each other on the journey, we must find a way to do so.

The South Dakota Synod identified that we would journey together in Christ through relating with intentionality, networking across the church, equipping leaders, and sharing leadership, because we are confident that Christ loves all. Through prayer and discernment, the executive board of the synod has affirmed the pilot effort to provide a 'Rural Ministry Liaison' to congregations who are currently without a rostered minister working through the call process.

The 'Rural Ministry Liaison' would build intentional relationships with our rural ministry sites through immersion in 14-day increments. During these extended stays they would listen, learn and care for our rural ministry partners. They would network these rural sites with other sites and the wider church, as well as recognize and foster leadership gifts in local people. They would, like Jesus on the road, listen to the people in the faith community, and at the same time teach them through scripture about the hope that lies within the waters of baptism; so that, in turn, they can rediscover that their hearts were burning inside them all along for the purpose of revitalizing ministry and becoming once again bearers of the Good News that Christ loves all.
