



## **REFLECTIONS FROM PASTOR PAM!**

Part of growing in our faith and our spiritual lives is exploring the Bible with new eyes. It's about reading familiar stories and seeing them anew, and connecting them to our lives. It's exciting to read a story from the Bible, look at what the people were doing, what God was doing, and then exploring how those stories apply to us today – because they do! We can learn so much from the stories in the Bible and especially how the early church grew in faith and community.





In the next month or so, you will be given many opportunities to be part of an Acts Bible Study. The Transformational Ministry Team will be offering the Bible Study at different times and days so that everyone can find a time that they can come. **2019 Mission Plan/Budget**—The 2019 Mission Plan & Budget was presented by Joy Smolnisky. We expect the income to increase by 2.8%. Changes for 2019 include: 1.4% salary increase, 1.4% increase in budgeted missions, additional \$1,000 each month to debt retirement, conducting background checks, parking lot resurfacing, parsonage deck materials, A/C in the parsonage bedroom, upgrade computer software. (**M/S/A** 2019 Mission Plan.)

#### **Old Business:**

- Parsonage Committee—Rex reported that the fencing is complete. Thanks to Chas for his work.
- \* iMatch—Rex reported on the process of matching up skills with serving at the church. It is a work in progress.

#### Parish Nurse News...

The Health Ministry Team & I are gearing up for our next "Information Table". We hope you have been checking out all the great information on food choices on our current table! In the next month, we will be changing out all of the information. We are going to focus on **Health & Fitness**. Here are some tips for fitness I got through the Mayo Clinic. Always check with your Doctor first!

- + **Heart Disease**: Regular exercise, including aerobic and interval training, will lower your risk of dying from heart disease and also help you maintain a healthier blood pressure.
- → Diabetes: Regular exercise helps maintain a healthy weight, controls blood sugar levels and boosts your energy level.
- **Back Pain**: Regular low-impact exercises can increase muscle strength and endurance for your back. "Core Strengthening Exercises" may especially reduce symptoms and increase function.
- ★ Arthritis: Keeping your joints moving will reduce joint stiffness and improve physical function and quality of life. Working with hand weights will improve strength and endurance.
- → **Dementia**: exercise can improve cognition in dementia. People who are active on a regular basis are at less risk of impairment.

Let's all get out and exercise as we are able in order to live a fuller and happier life!

## Council Minutes - January 15, 2019

Treasurer's Report—Joy explained the changes reflected the inclusion of the accounts that had not been previously included in the general budget. 2018 offering contributions closed the year at 101.7% of budget, exceeding expectations by \$5,870.62. CLF closed the fiscal year with a net positive operating cash flow position of \$5,778. (Some of this money does have ear-marked obligation.).

#### **Unfinished Business:**

- **→ Thrivent Choice**—\$153.00 had been contributed in January to CLF from Choice Dollars.
- **→ Attendance/Financial Statistics** were reviewed.
- + Background Checks—Many of the forms sent out have been returned. The next step will be to enter information with the designated company, Shepard's Watch. All information will be confidentially held with Pastor Pam.
- + Finance Committee Update
  - a. The council approved the addition of new council members and removing of people no longer authorized to sign checks at the two banks involved. (M/S/A)
  - b. The council reviewed changes in the 2019 Proposed Budget, which reflect all of the many subgroups and categories that have been spending monies outside of the official budget. These changes will assist CLF in having a better understanding of how much money is actually received and spent per year.
  - c. The Stewardship Drive update indicated that 86 pledge cards had been handed in; up from last year's 74 handed in.
- → Nominating Committee Update—David Pickford and Carol Niemann have accepted the call to be on the council. Two other names are needed. Thanks to the members going off the council.
- + Active Shooter Information—Tabled until Rosemary returns in the Spring.

#### New Business:

- → Membership Changes—No changes noted.
- ★ Report from Budget Forum held January 13—Joy reviewed information shared at the Budget Forum. \$500.00 more was earmarked for the SPARK kids as a result. Council approved the updated modifications to the 2019 budget proposal for submission to the congregation at the annual meeting. (M/S/A)
- **→ Snow Removal Bids**—No action has been taken
- + Purchase of Microphones—Agreed to allow Bill Tretheway to make a free-will offering for acquiring two microphones for personal use.
- → Draft Agenda of Annual Meeting—Reviewed and approved.
- → Financial Review Committee Report—The council approved the Financial Review Committee's report with follow-up to be completed by the Finance Committee to address the issues uncovered in the review. (M/S/A)
- → Parsonage Furnishings Allowance—The council voted to designate \$500 of the total cash salary for 2019 to be paid to Rev. Power as a furnishing allowance in response to pastor's request.
- → 2019 Bank Signature Authority—Resolution was approved. There is an attachment describing specific names/actions. (M/S/A)

Reflections on Mission and Ministry—Pastor Pam reported on the conference she attended in Chicago which is designed to develop community programs.

#### Committee & Ministry Team Reports:

- + **Property** Paul reported that monitoring of the snow build-up on the east side of the church needed to be an ongoing activity during the snow months. Rex will check it out currently.
- → **Social Ministry**—A pancake breakfast fundraiser is scheduled for Feb. 24 with proceeds to be split between the Pine Ridge Hail Damage project and the Cornerstone Mission. The Lenten mission offerings will again promote five local organizations.
- **→ Transformation Ministry Team**—will meet January 24.
