SOCIAL MINISTRY

LENTEN SEASON OFFERING - HELP US BUILD A MOUNTAIN

"On the mountain of the Lord it will be provided." Genesis 22:14

Your Social Ministry Team is once again planning an exciting way for us to participate in a Lenten Season Offering. As in recent years, we will be building a mountain at the altar with our offerings. Various items needed by non-profits, who are conducting God's work in our community will be collected during Sunday and Wednesday services for five weeks beginning February 26th. We will focus on the following organizations: W.E.A.V.E., Operation Black Hills Cabin, The Storehouse, Pine Ridge Diaper Drive and Humane Society—Custer.

Listed below is a list of items needed by each of these non-profit organizations:

W.E.A.V.E.— Women Escaping a Violent Environment

A very special organization in our community that has been helping women and children in need for over 20 years.

→ Toilet paper, paper towels, shampoo & conditioner, new or gently used baby sleepers sizes 6—24 months, gently used jeans for teen boys

The Storehouse —

Their mission is serve people in Custer County by receiving and distributing with respect and compassion donated food and household items.

+ Canned fruit & vegetables, peanut butter, pasta, canned meat, soups

Pine Ridge Diaper Drive —

Diapers are as essential to a child's basic needs as food and shelter—yet state and federal programs do not offer special funding for those in need.

→ Disposable diapers, especially sizes 5 and 6 (some 1s, 2s & 4s as well).

Humane Society — Custer

a no-kill, animal shelter serving Custer County. At present they are caring for 35 dogs, 25 cats, a blind horse, a cow with a broken hip, a donkey, birds and even a squirrel with seizures. Most of the animals are older or have health issues and will live out their lives at the shelter.

+ Dry cat food, monetary donations to over costs of medicine and veterinary bills

Operation Black Hills Cabin —

Their mission is to provide a comfortable, peaceful and support respite to qualified, combat-injured veterans and their families. Small, inexpensive items are given to each family member visiting the cabin. The cabin can host 17 families each year.

- → The children's book, "Who Pooped in the Black Hills" to be given to boys
- → Locking journals/diaries to be given to girls
- + Family-oriented games, puzzles and simple toys that will remain in the cabin library. Items would need to be appropriate for toddler to teenage.
- → There are also 7 games that need to be replaced at the cabin: Operation, Chutes and Ladders, Littlest Pet Shop Monopoly, Chess, Checkers, Backgammon and Chinese Checkers. And there are 2 card games that need replacing: Uno and Old Maid.

If you're planning on offering one of these replacement games, please contact Connie at bradmckinney@gmail.com to avoid duplication.

- → The cabin has about a dozen puzzles appropriate for small children, 2 decks of regular playing cards, and the following games that are in good condition (so OBHC does NOT need these): Connect 4, Sequence, The All American Trivia Board Game, Challenge Yahtzee, Horse Sense, Disney Edition Memory Game, Dominoes, Such a Thing?, Outburst II, Monopoly, Candy Land, Are You Smarter Than a 5th Grader?, and Scrabble.
- → Any kind of Black Hills souvenir, gender neutral and without sizes, would also be appreciated small things that can be put into the gift bags each family receives. Volunteers do not know the sizes of guests.

You are welcome to bring any and all donations to the altar (or church office) during the first 5 weeks of Lent. You are also welcome to bring in a special monetary offering for the non-profit to the altar (or church office) as well.

Recommendation by Finance Committee to research ICON software web-based accounting module as a potential replacement for desktop QuickBooks. Would run the ICON module parallel with QuickBooks in 2023 to compare. If it is found to meet the church's needs and approved by the Council, the transition could be implemented in 2024.
