I am so excited about all the ways the Holy Spirit continues to work within and through Custer Lutheran Fellowship!

After a lot of prayer, discussion, and review of the 103 worship surveys you all completed, the CLF Church Council has voted to begin one worship service at 9:30 AM beginning on the first Sunday of Lent, March 1, 2020.

We are delighted about the openness to the movement of the Holy Spirit during this time of prayer and discernment for everyone in the congregation, but especially for those on the Worship Survey Team. Thank you to Cindy Anderson, Helena Buehler, Cozy Dorton, Mary Hoscheid, Janna Jorgensen, Liz Kleffner, Ginny Myers, and Bonnie Thompson for their prayerful work in this process.



This decision was not entered into lightly, but instead was considered with a great deal of prayer and discernment for where the Holy Spirit is leading us as a congregation. We looked not only at how we could best serve God as a congregation, but also at what would best serve the community of Custer. We believe strongly that this move is what the Spirit wants us to do.

The church as a whole continually changes and moves with the Spirit, or at least it should. When we stop listening to the movement of the Spirit, we start to stagnate, and we lose our connection with the power of the Spirit.

CLF has certainly experienced some changes over the last six to eight

years, some difficult, some exciting. We are celebrating all the ways God has worked through each of you and through this congregation and are moving forward in the way to which we feel called.

Our Wednesday NightLife activities will remain the same with SPARK Kids at 4:00 PM, a meal at 5:15 PM, worship at 6:00 PM, and confirmation, RAP group, and choir at 6:30 PM. These are such an important part of our life at CLF, and the Spirit clearly works through our Wednesday night activities!

We will continue to enjoy our choir, the worship bands, and a variety of music in worship. These are all such important parts of our worship life here, and the Spirit clearly works through all the different music and musicians!

One of the interesting insights that came out of the survey was that virtually everyone checked the box for valuing fellowship here at CLF. We definitely agree that our fellowship and relationships with each other and the community are a big part of who we are. We are looking forward to how this change will strengthen our fellowship and relationship-building with each other, and with the community. We also encourage you all to join in fellowship, coffee, and treats each Sunday after the worship service.

Construction of the new Woyatan Retreat Center has seen some real progress this fall thanks to the nice weather and a lot of help from our great volunteers. We have made significant progress just in the last several weeks as the walls and attic were insulated by project leader Larry Peterson and a group of some of our most regular volunteers -- Chuck Hazlett and Craig Black from Custer; Tom Berg, Kurt Anderson, and Jim Bishop from South Canyon; and Jim Schuh from Trinity. By mid-December, both floors were sheet rocked, taped, and textured.

We are also thrilled to finally have HEAT in the building. In January, we will be looking for volunteers to prime

MENTAL HEALTH NEWS

I've been following recent news articles giving the high statistics of our state's **addictions rates**. Our governor has started an ad campaign relating to the idea that "we are on it". While it has made the news because of the wording, it is not at all funny. We have to ask ourselves why this is. I believe a big reason is that addiction rates and mental health issues often relate to **increased poverty levels**.

Poverty often claims decades of generations. Being in poverty is painful. It diminishes our self-worth, and often leads to increased criminal activity or to addictions. What can we do? Yes, more treatments for addiction are vital, but it is at least as important, to address our high poverty levels. Giving people more chances at improving living conditions, better nutrition, improving educational opportunities and lifting up their self-esteem is a big step forward. It is not easy, and each facet of help is important, but I know it can be done. We must do it for our families, neighbors, the young and elderly. **Look around our community and you will see many in need of our help**.

COUNCIL MINUTES - DECEMBER 17, 2019

Treasurer's Report—The council reviewed the treasurer's report which was submitted by Joy. The contributions YTD are at 93.5% of the budgeted amount.


Unfinished Business:

- → Finance Committee Report—The Council reviewed all the Committee's 2019 Budget Recommendations (Attached to council agenda, page 6) The Council specified that the undistributed SD Synod Capital Appeal Funds (\$1,333.33) be redistributed in December 2019, with 50% to Lutheran Social Services of South Dakota and 50% to Lutheran Disaster Relief. Liz moved, it was seconded and the council unanimously approved the Finance Committee's Recommendations.
- **→ Thrivent Choice**—Received in November —\$24; received \$1,965 year-to-date.
- + Amazon Smile—\$11.23 received in November for 3rd quarter 2019. \$34.48 received year-to-date.
- ◆ Sanctuary Exit Door —Gene Fennell noted that there is a serious problem with the Exit door as there is a step with an outward opening exit door. This is potentially a life-threatening problem. Gene will design a change in the exit stairway to meet this need. One of the other problems noted is that there are often items blocking the doorway, such as music stands, stools, etc. A "panic bar" is also needed.

New Business:

- → Finance Committee Report—The council reviewed the proposals for the upcoming 2020 budget year submitted by the Finance Committee. After discussions to understand the proposals, Carol moved to accept the recommendations. Second and approved unanimously by Council.
- **→ Membership Changes**—None.
- → Worship Survey Team Recommendations—Pastor Pam reported on the Worship Survey Team, noting that the team very much felt led by the Spirit as 103 surveys were completed and discussions had been complete. The council moved, it was seconded, and approved to follow the recommendations of the Team to have one service each Sunday with 9:30 AM starting time; implementation to be March 1, 2020.
- ◆ Wendi Rusch Mission Trip Support
 —Wendi has the opportunity to assist with a program of working with sign language in Jamaica in March and asked for financial assistance. The council felt this was a worthy request as Wendi will most likely bring back ideas and cultural excitement for the SPARK program. The proposed method of fund-raising was to have Wendi do a temple talk with an offering basket and to then supplement the funding as needed. (This provides an opportunity for the congregation to engage in the adventure.)
- ★ Annual Meeting Reports—are due to the office by January 10, 2020.
- → International Health Partners
 —The council discussed the opportunity to have a group involved with building clinics and hospitals in Tanzania come to provide a worship experience. It was the general feeling of the council that unless the group was of Lutheran background, opening up the worship sermon and service to an outside group could lead to an abuse of worship time. A temple talk and a group discussion outside of the worship hour were suggested.

Reflections on Mission and Ministry—Pastor Pam has been busy with the usual church activities as well as serving with the Custer County Long Term Recovery Group. The first checks have been distributed for the



flood victims. Planning the Advent and Christmas festivities have been part of the work.

- ★ Endowment—Liz reported that the recent seminar on endowment funds had been enlightening.
- → Evangelism—Rosemary reported the group was still working on a booklet.
- → Health Ministry—The Team has a new health board on display and hopes to have an AED training in the new year.
