Hope is a powerful thing. We see both fear and hope throughout the Bible. We just celebrated the birth of Christ which began with both fear and hope. Mary was understandably afraid when the angel appeared and told her this unbelievable news that she would be having a baby. But that gave way to trust and hope. Trust in God and hope for the future.

grief, loneliness, anxiety, fear, and joy.

As this new year begins, I pray that we all approach it with trust and hope, and even joy. Trust that God is with us, hope for the future, and joy in our Savior. May this be a year where we all grow in our trust, joy, and hope in God's Son, our Savior, Jesus the Christ.

hospitals & clinics will be able to get the vaccine to health care workers, our Nursing Home residents and other front line workers will have the option to receive the vaccine. Seeds for Nicaragua

The South Dakota Synod Companion Synod ministry helps us to better know our siblings in Christ from around the world—especially in our companion synods in Nicaragua and Cameroon.

The Lutheran Church, Faith & Hope of Nicaragua is one of our companions in faith and service. This year, the people of Nicaragua endured two large hurricanes which devastated over 44,000 homes and drowned the crops of the subsistence farmers in the region. These people are in desperate need of help.

Sixty to eighty percent of the farmers in the region are women and children. Programs from the ELCA have helped these farmers learn how to better tend their land, what to plant and how to use best farming practices like use of irrigation. The small family farms joined into cooperatives to help work and tend their crops together. There are currently 15 cooperatives going in the area. The hurricane totally destroyed the crops and houses of 9 of the cooperatives. That's a couple hundred families' resources wiped out. This catastrophe comes on top of the COVID-19 pandemic. The pandemic hit the area hard and caused many to miss one of the two harvests this year because of sickness. People were already desperate when the final blows of 2 hurricanes hit.

Our missionary, Rev. Dr. Soliette Lopez Ortega, shared that hunger has already become a problem and a true famine in the area could occur if something is not done to help. They hope to be able to replant this fall when the water recedes or barring that possibility, plant another crop in the spring. But... **THEY HAVE NO MONEY FOR SEED!**

As people of the land, we understand the need for seed and soil to harvest. We know the hardship of no harvests. In the United States, we have insurance and farm plans from our government to fall back on. The people of Nicaragua have nothing to help them out of this disaster.

They have nothing but us...their partners in prayer and faith.

We are asking the people of the South Dakota Synod to step up and help our companion synod siblings from Nicaragua as we journey together in Christ to raise money to buy seeds for the future and hope in Nicaragua.

Each cooperative's seed will cost them \$1,445.00. We are setting a goal of raising \$14,000.00 for the farmers in Nicaragua.

Synod Assembly


June 4-5, 2021

COUNCIL MINUTES - DECEMBER 15, 2020 MEETING

Treasurer's and Finance Committee's Report: Joy's submitted reports reviewed the current statement of financial position and the offering trends. The November giving rate was slightly higher so the overall giving levels are approximately 8.7% YTD below budget. Projected End of Year: 91% of Budget so this computes to around \$30,000 less than was budgeted. The Finance Committee had a number of end of the year and proposed 2021 items to be addressed. See attached sheet for specific items and the actions taken.

Unfinished Business:

- → Thrivent Choice— \$21 received in November—\$1949 YTD
- + Review of worship and activities—Worship in-person and on-line has remained steady. Confirmation Sunday had involved extra chairs for seating as will be anticipated for Christmas services.
- → Annual Meeting—It was decided that no potluck would be provided as a number of members had said this was too risky. Instead, a coffee only gathering will be held on January 24, 2021. Reports of committee members are due Friday, January 8, 2021.

New Business:

- + Annual Meeting Forum Date—As a preview to the annual meeting, a forum to review the proposed budget will be held on January 17, 2021.
- + Endowment Fund Distribution—The Youth Endowment distributions that were approved in the Treasurer and Finance sections above provided: \$300 to YMCA for basketball jerseys and youth basketball, \$1,325 to Freshman Impact, \$1,125 to Outlaw Ranch for Youth programming, \$1,125 to Library for home craft/activity bags, and \$1,625 to Lifeways for drug and alcohol prevention and education.


Reflections on Mission and Ministry: Pastor Pam was busy with Confirmation and the youth scavenger hunt. The Wednesday Advent series has been ongoing.
