# BLESSING AND CHALKING OF HOMES



The act of chalking a home's door is a long Christian tradition that typically occurs in the season of Epiphany. The markings, "20 + C + M + B + 22," abbreviates the Latin phrase, *Christus mansionem benedicat*: "May Christ bless the house." The "+" signs represent the cross, and the "20" at the beginning and the "22" at the end mark the year. Taken together, this inscription is performed as an outward devotion to God, asking His blessings in the new year and to pay homage to the Magi who visited Christ in his first

home. This is why it is done during Epiphany, which is when we celebrate the visit of the Magi.

Pastor Pam invites you to be part of this tradition this year. There is a schedule on the Welcome Center with dates and times you can sign up to have her come to your home and participate in the blessing and chalking of your home. Purchased this year were: 12 chicks, a rooster, 2 goats, 10 piglets, 2 honeybee bundles, 2 water filters, 17 school supply bundles, vaccinations for a child, 2 weeks of food for a refugee family, 6 bibles, and 11 backpacks stocked with food.

# CUSTER COMMUNITY CHRISTMAS...

For the second year, the Christmas Food Basket and Select-A-Gift portions of the Custer Community Christmas was held at CLF on Saturday, December 18<sup>th</sup>. On Friday the 17<sup>th</sup>, 190 food baskets were assembled and the S-A-G committee assembled the gifts in the Fireside Room. The hams & turkeys were delivered on Saturday morning and then from 10 AM to Noon, registered families came out and picked up their food baskets along with





December of 2021 definitely did not go at all as I had planned! The whole month was a struggle for me personally.

It began with my planned gastric sleeve surgery on the 6<sup>th</sup>. I had been working up to having that surgery since July. I was nervous about it, but I knew it was the best way forward for me to be healthy. The surgery itself was fine, but I struggled with nausea for several days. And, of course, pain from the surgery itself.

I thought I was recovering well, although not as fast as I had hoped. I was far more tired than I thought I would be. I was wondering how I was going to be able to preside at the Longest Night/Blue Christmas service as well as both Christmas Eve services because everything seemed to wear me out. I figured I would manage, though. I was excited to be back with all of you in worship, especially for those powerful and holy services.

And then in the morning of Saturday, December 18<sup>th</sup> I woke up with pain in my left thigh. I thought I had slept on it funny or something, but then my calf started hurting, and the pain kept getting worse. I knew what it was. I told Chas he had to hurry and get me to the ER because I had blood clots in my left leg.

That was a very scary day, not only for me, but for Chas and Matt, too. They were so afraid for me because blood clots can be deadly. And I was in so much pain. I ended up being transferred to Monument in Rapid City and spent the next 5 nights there. I had one very large clot near my hip, and multiple smaller ones from my thigh to my foot. They gave me blood thinners right away, which began breaking up the smaller ones. They were able to remove some of the large clot and break up the rest of it with powerful drugs.

It was scary and frustrating and painful and depressing all rolled into one. I was angry that this was happening to me; angry that I wouldn't be able to be there with all of you for Christmas week. And if I'm going to be honest, even angry at God.

But I got through it and made it home on the 23<sup>rd</sup>. And I have no doubt that what helped me get through this ordeal and brought me home was God and definitely all of your prayers. I know my family and I have been held in prayer by so many people during all of this.

I found this picture after I got home and it really spoke to me. It feels like I've been in the pit of fire going through so much, but that's not the end of the story. New life is the beginning. Struggles and setbacks and horrible things that happen to us are never the end of the story. New things are birthed from the fires of struggle and pain. Not that God causes any suffering or makes bad things happen in order to teach us a lesson. That is not who God is. God is full of love for each and every one of us and would never intentionally cause us pain. But that doesn't mean that God is absent in those times. God is there in the midst of our struggles, keeping us going, giving us strength, helping us persevere, and surrounding us with people to help us along the journey.

I know God has been with me throughout all of this. Working through all the medical staff at the hospital who took such good and loving care of me. God was working through Chas and Matt as they worried and took wonderful care of me when I came home. And God continues to work through all of you in your prayers.

My hope is that the new life I will see coming out of this will be better health for me, and a long and healthy life spent with my family. Out of the flame comes new life. Yes, we may feel singed and burned, but new life will always spring forth.

May this new year bring each of us new life and new joy in following our Savior Jesus!





# W/ELCA Happenings...

Next meeting: Monday, January 17, 2022 @ 11:30 AM in the Fireside Room.

Hostesses: We will each pack our own lunch. Beverages and dessert will be provided.

**Program:** Sherry Broderick—Case Manager for LSS Blessing Bags and Jessica Lillebo LSS Director of Donor Relations will be our speakers. Sherry will tell us more about "Blessing Bags". Who gets them and how the recipients are identified. Jessica will be here to give information and to answer questions in general concerning LSS. If you do not know what a Blessing Bag is, please come to our meeting to learn and to share in quality fellowship.

During the last half of October and the first half of November, the W/ELCA ladies collected items to be used in the Lutheran social Service's "Loads of Love" project.

We were collecting and donating items to be put into laundry baskets. Items that we collected were given to foster children who were at least 18 years old and getting ready to go out on their own to live in an apartment or other rental property. LSS social workers start working with foster children to help prepare them to live on their own when they are 16 years old.

We were given a list of items from LSS. Items were to help the young adults as they began their journey to set up housekeeping. Items that we put into laundry baskets included cleaning supplies, kitchen cooking utensils, pots and pans, bath towels, bath soap, kitchen towels, paper towels, toilet paper, laundry detergent, dish washing

detergent, and many other items relating to the "start up" of a new chapter in life

Thanks to the seed money that was provided from a Thrivent Card and the generous donations from the W/ELCA ladies, we were able to fill six laundry

baskets with about \$900 worth of items. It is a pleasure To be able to help young people in this way.

**QUILTING** — On January11<sup>th</sup>, Quilting resumes on each Tuesday morning starting at 9:00 AM. The W/ELCA mission project for January—March is to support the quilters as they work to provide quilts for Lutheran World Relief and local needs. Items that are needed are thread, cotton fabric suitable for making quilts, and cotton blankets and /or mattress pads for inside quilts. If you would like to donate any of these items, they can be left in the sewing room. Thanks in advance for supporting this very important outreach.

# COUNCIL MINUTES - DECEMBER 14, 2021 MEETING

**Members Present:** Christie Behlings, Jackie Hartwick, Emily Hiatt, Scot Hoscheid, Liz Kleffner, Carol Niemann and Dave Pickford. Not Present: Samuel Ainsley and Pastor Pam Power.

**Secretary's Report:** The correspondence was reviewed. Dave moved, Scot seconded and the minutes for the November meeting were approved with corrections. Worship attendance records were reviewed.

**Treasurer's and Finance Committee's Report:** The year to date offering is 9% over budget. November expenditures were under the monthly budget and are 89% of budget year to date.

- + 2021 Budget Council decisions made as part of the 2021 budget discussion.
  - ♦ Leave the \$12,000 budgeted debt reduction in to be used for debt reduction.
  - ♦ Designated the PPP dollars to operational reserve. This \$26,667 is a one-time influx
  - Designated the Thrivent amount of \$667 to go to Lutheran's Outdoors for Outlaw Ranch camp scholarships.
  - ◆ Designated the Lynn's DakotaMart receipt refund program dollars of \$1,600 to be used for FFE (Furnishings, Fixtures, Equipment) set aside.
  - Designated the WNL donations of \$801 to go to ordinary income.
  - Designated \$930 to unrestricted memorials. Discussed using these funds to upgrade the church sign.
  - ◆ Designated Church use donations of \$1,283 to the FFE account.
- ◆ 2022 Budget As part of the 2022 budget estimate the Council:
  - Recommended an income estimate of \$297,500.
  - Recommended using a 3% COLA for salaries and missions.
  - Reviewed and gave guidance to the Treasurer on the estimated 2022 budget comments.
  - Reviewed timeline of the budget process. Budget forums will be scheduled for January 9<sup>th</sup> and 16<sup>th</sup>. The Annual Meeting is scheduled for January 23<sup>rd</sup>.

# **ELW DEVOTIONS FROM THE DAILY LECTIONARY**

### 1 Christmas
