SOCIAL MINISTRY -- "GOOD GIFTS" SUMMARY

Your Social Ministry Team sponsored ELCA "Good Gifts" in late November and early December. Farm animals, educational and development projects can make a world of difference for a family in need. With our gifts, together, we help families escape the cycle of hunger and poverty.

Purchased this year were: 7 chicks, 9 roosters, 1 family farm, 2 goats, 2 goats + flock of chicks, 1 couple of goats, 7 piglets, 1 share of a cow, 6 honeybees, 1 share of a simple water well, 2 water filters, 1 latrine, 4 school fees & uniform for a girl, 6 school supplies for a child, 2 fruit-tree seedlings, 2 mosquito nets, 2 vaccinations for a child, 3 bibles, and 1 backpack stocked with food.

A total of \$2,246 was raised from sales at church. We know that others at CLF support "Good Gifts" online, so there are many gifts beyond what are reflected above. Thank you for selecting gifts for others and supporting this mission work.

CALLING A NEW PASTOR ... WHAT'S NEXT? Steps in seeking a New Pastor...



STEP ONE — Inform Synod Office — Check

STEP TWO — Arrange for Pastoral Assistance during the transition — Check

STEP THREE — Congregational Assessment — Check. Ministry Site Profile (MSP) was completed and approved by the Council at the December meeting. MSP was then submitted to the Synod.

STEP FOUR — Ministry Site Study — Check. Held on December 5, 2022.

STEP FIVE — Candidates — The Call Committee receives Rostered Minister Profiles (RMP) from the Synod. These candidate profiles are sent from the Synod office to the Call Committee chairperson after the site study has been completed and MSP submitted.

Step Five is where CLF is at in the call process. As we receive profiles, the committee will review and make decisions. They know there will be hard questions to answer, but they are keeping their love of this church and understanding that they are representing the congregation in their decisions foremost.

As we continue on, we ask you to continue to pray, trust, practice patience, and to share any concerns and/or ideas with Call Committee members — Craig Black, Mindy Dooley, John Kirk, Dave Mertz, Sara Mooney, Paul Niemann, Teresa Obenauer, Scott Olson, Denali Rusch, Joy Smolnisky and Dean Suelflow.

PARISH NURSE UPDATE

Our Health Ministry Team met in December and went over the info we will be putting out in January as we change out our information table. We hope it will be helpful to a number of people in our congregation. The theme is, keeping you in your home longer. Often times when people age they begin to have minor mishaps. Then those minor mishaps can turn into



something that could be disabling. We will be giving out information to help keep you in your home as long as possible. In time you or your family may realize it is no longer safe for you to stay at home alone. Many don't have family close by, which complicates things further. It is not necessarily time for a Nursing Home. We will be giving other options to try first. Sometimes it's a matter of having he right equipment and a safe home. Then, do you need help all the time or just a few times a day. What options are available in our area? Where do we even begin! Let us help you.

Later in January, check our information table for the new information we will be providing for you. Anything on the table can be taken, but if you take the last one, let one of us know. Information pinned on the board should remain there. If you want that information, ask one of us to make you a copy.

January has 5 Sundays in it. Our Health Ministry Team will be there on the 5_{th} Sunday of January for a prayer service. After you receive communion come to the back by the baptismal fountain and we will offer prayers on your behalf, a loved one or other concerns.

We are very happy we have added a new member to our group. Diana Edwards joined us at our December meeting and we look forward to some fresh new ideas. If anyone else has an interest, let me know!

From the Bishop's Desk

New Year's Greetings South Dakota Synod!

Grace and peace to you in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit! - The majority of you are preparing for your annual meeting at which you will elect new leaders to serve on the council and in other capacities representing your congregation in the community you are planted in. Allow me to say a thank you to those who have concluded their service and a welcome to those who will begin their service. As the Bishop of the South Dakota Synod I am grateful for your willingness to serve in times such as these.

The synod's mission statement is: journeying together in Christ and is based on Luke's narrative of the walk to Emmaus after the resurrection. Jesus joins two disciples on the road as they journey from Jerusalem to Emmaus to clear their heads from everything they had seen and heard these past few days. Jesus joins them on the way, but their preoccupied minds and hearts don't permit them to recognize Jesus. It isn't until Jesus joins them at the supper table, where he breaks the bread that their eyes and hearts are finally receptive to who has been with them all along. And despite the darkness and possible danger, despite being hungry after a day's journey and despite their tired and weary bodies they hurry back to Jerusalem to share the good news that they have seen the Lord.

As you begin your service as a council member I hope you will amidst the weary works of your day and sometimes even in the church discover the risen Christ continues to show up at your council meetings to reveal who you are and who we are as the living and breathing body of Christ. Your work may include mundane decisions such as paying the bills and choosing curriculum, finding soloists and ushers, but never underestimate the power of Christ in your midst. He may just have been journeying alongside you, without you recognizing him. I pray that you are called to carry out your given task with an open heart, mind and spirit only to discover that Christ has been a part of the church at large and your community in particular long before you.

I also invite you to join the synod staff for an educational event on Zoom titled: "You have been elected to council, now what?" We have done these workshops for a few years now and the number of people participating is growing every year. Together we will learn about what it means to serve on the council, that your constitution is not a weapon, but your missional document, how to utilize the resources the synod has to accompany your congregation, how to create a spirit of generosity and much more.
