We had 26 Spark kids and a few confirmation kids who participated by reading about the ornaments' symbolism and hanging them on the tree. The children also played a few songs on the handbells that sounded amazing! It was a great way to start the celebration of the season! They are very focused! Great Work, kids!



SOCIAL MINISTRY - "GOOD GIFTS" SUMMARY

Your Social Ministry Team sponsored ELCA "Good Gifts" in late November and early December. Farm animals, educational and development projects can make a world of difference for a family in need. With our gifts, together, we help families escape the cycle of hunger and poverty.

Purchased in 2023, through CLF, were: 9 chicks, 3 roosters, 5 goats, 1 herd of goats, 8 piglets, 12 honeybee units, 2 water filters, 1 irrigation project, 1 community center computer, 2 microloans for a woman, 4 school fees & uniform for a girl, 5 school supplies for a child, 1 school supplies for a classroom, 3 fruit-tree seedlings, 1 one-year nutrition for a child, 4 vaccinations for a child, 1 feed-a-refuge family for a week, 1 month of trauma counseling, 3 bibles, and 1 feed 10 at a soup kitchen. A total of \$4,371 was raised from such sales at church (compared to \$2,246 in 2022!). We know that others at CLF support "Good Gifts" online, so there are many gifts beyond what are reflected above. Thank you for selecting gifts for others and supporting this mission work.

SOCIAL MINISTRY -- "RECYCLING PLASTIC FILM"



Recycling Plastic Film - Wondering what the new collection box in the Narthex is all about? The Custer Lions Club shared an invitation for CLF to join their effort to recycle various forms of plastic film. We have now established this collection point and encourage the congregation to deposit their appropriate plastic. A list of the types of plastic to recycle is available at the collection box. Once 1,000 lbs of plastic has been recycled, Trex will donate a bench to the Lions Club. The next 1,000 lbs. of plastic will then be turned in for a Trex bench for CLF. THURSDAY MORNING BOOK STUDY BY BONNIE THOMPSON

The Thursday morning, Christian women's book study meets at 9:30 at the Monument Health assisted-living center, which used to be the Wedgwood Assisted Living. We usually have between six and 10 women who get together for about an hour and a half to read discuss, laugh and learn. All women are invited to come.

The new book that we are starting is called "Crazy Love: Overwhelmed by a Relentless God" by Francis Chan and Danae Yankowski.

God is calling you to a passionate love relationship with himself because the answer to religious complacency isn't working harder at a list of dues and don'ts is falling in love with God. The Men's Breakfast will meet on **January** 13th at 8:00 AM in the Fireside Room. The men gather for a breakfast first then move on to their Bible study for the day. All are welcome to join this group. We have great discussions.







We had a good 2023 studying and discussing some notable Parables of the Kingdom: The Sower and the Seed; The Good Samaritan; The Prodigal; The Wheat and the Weeds, The Pearl of Great Price; The Treasure in the Field; The Parable of the Net; The Ten Virgins and the Parable of the Talents. All of these, in allegorical form, told of one or more truths of God's Kingdom---simple stories that help us remember the precious gift we possess in the Word of God.

We will begin 2024 with a study of Genesis Chapters 1 - 11. Why should we care? Because the first eleven chapters of the Bible in Genesis are the prologue to the rest of the Scriptures. This is the Introduction to the story of God's redemption of His people through the Gospel of Jesus Christ. And just like with any good book or movie, you can't skip the introduction. If you do, you'll fail to grasp the tension, the main themes and the plot lines and trajectories that are going to be dealt with; the conflict and how it gets resolved in the end.

So, Genesis 1 - 11 is the Prologue. It explains why the world is in such a mess that it is in. It explains both supernatural and human evil. Here's what humanity is up against: We are estranged from God; we have all kinds of problems that can't be resolved by human means, and not only that, there are spiritual powers that are opposed to God's interest in having us back. Because rebellion and sin have separated us from God, we also have another problem: death. Every living thing dies because of sin. In addition, there's also the problem of supernatural (angelic) and human depravity---practices and customs that are totally ungodly. And finally, humanity is fractured----separated not only from God, but from one another. The rest of the Bible is the story of God not giving up on His original plan. But now, He has rivals and enemies on both sides. So, this is the story. And how Jesus, God Incarnate, walks everything back and reverses the curse of sin, and brings everything to resolution. But to fully appreciate all that, Genesis 1 through 11, from Eden to Abraham, lays the foundation for the story of redemption.

We shouldn't skip the Introduction. It is vital to fully understanding the story.

GRIEF RECOVERY METHOD

The Grief Recovery Method(R) 8 week support group will meet at CLF. Meetings will begin on Monday, Feb. 5th and will run for 8 weeks from 5:30 PM to 7:30 PM. This is not an open support group which means you must commit to attending all 8 sessions. The Grief Recovery Method(R) is an evidence based emotional healing process to help recover from more than 43 different kinds of losses we can experience. The book, "The Grief Recovery Handbook" by John James and Russell Friedman is the book we use and each participant needs a book. Each week there will be reading and writing assignments to be discussed in the sessions. Cost will be \$150 per person for the 8 sessions. COUNCIL MINUTES - DECEMBER 19, 2023 MEETING

Secretary's Report: The correspondence was reviewed There was consensus and the minutes for the September meeting were approved. Worship attendance records were reviewed.

Treasurer's and Finance Committee's Report: The offerings thru November were 118% (+\$4,378) of budget and YTD income is at 109.7% (+\$25,764) over budget.

YTD expenses are only \$705 over budget.

- ❖ 2023 Pledge Receipts as of 12/12/23: are at 97.5% with \$203,573.48 of \$208,808 total 2023 pledges received with only \$5,234.52 outstanding.
- ❖ 2024 Pledges as of 12/12/23: 66 pledge cards have been turned in (same number as 2023). The total pledge amount is \$248,000, an increase of \$39,192 from last year.

- ❖ Finance Committee 2024 Budget Recommendations Shana moved, John seconded to approve the Finance Committee's Recommendations as presented. Motion carried.
