

## Happy New Year!!!

For some of us, the new year is filled with excitement and possibilities. We are excited about what this new year will bring; excited to see where God will lead us and how God will be working in our lives. For some of us, the new year is scary or depressing, filled with dread. Or

it may not be that dramatic, but it may be yet another year with nothing to be especially excited about, or another year filled with grief or pain or loneliness.

The most important thing for me to always remember, no matter what is going on in my life, is that I am never alone. That God is always with me, and will never, ever leave me. That God is actively working in my life and in the world. I may not always see God working or feel God's presence, but I know He is there. And I have a lot of people around me who are more than happy to remind me of God's love for me.



#### To my CLF Family...





## Background Checks for Working with Youth

Because we care deeply for all of the children and youth who are part of this congregation, effective January 1<sup>st</sup>, we are starting a new process for those who have any contact with our children. All adults who help with any of our ministries at CLF that involve children or youth will be receiving a letter explaining that we need a "Volunteer Application" form, an acknowledgment of the "Guidelines for Interaction Between Volunteers and Youth/Children at Custer Lutheran Fellowship," and that we will be performing background checks. This includes everyone who is involved with Spark Kids (both volunteers in the classroom as well as drivers), Confirmation teachers, Confirmation mentors, RAP Group parents (both volunteers with the group as well as drivers), and nursery volunteers. This is both to protect our children, and to comply with our insurance company policies. All of the information collected will be kept confidential, and Pastor Pam will be the only one with access to the forms and results of the background checks. *Treasurer's Report*—The treasurer's report was deferred to finance committee item on the agenda. *Unfinished Business:* 


- Thrivent Choice—\$31.00 has been contributed to CLF from the Choice Dollars during this monthly time period. \$1,204.00 has been contributed through this fund year-to-date. \$69 of this money was given for LSS support, leaving a total of \$1,135.00. Brad moved that of the remaining plus the AmazonSmiles donations, totaling \$1,195.59, half be given to Custer Ministerial Alliance (CMA) and half to the Hail Damage Repair needed on Pine Ridge. This was seconded and approved. **(M/S/A)**
- <sup>a</sup> Attendance/Financial Statistics were reviewed.
- Background Checks—Pastor Pam has found a church based background check system —Group Publishing: Shepard's Watch—which provides basic and more comprehensive searches. The expenditures are covered by the allotment set aside.
- Finance Committee Update—Joy has worked to consolidate accounts. Sue moved and council approved motion to "approve finance committee obtain CPA consultation and assistance to implement accounting process to meet 2018 audit recommendations." (M/S/A) A number of employees are working without contracts. Rosemary moved, it was seconded and council approved motion "that a trial for one year using the proposed contract format be used." (M/S/A)
- <sup>a</sup> Fall Stewardship Campaign Update—Increased commitments of \$12,000 noted so far.
- Nominating Committee Update—Jan Sweere and Carol Neiman have graciously accepted the call. 1-2 more positions are still open.

#### New Business:

- Membership Changes—No changes noted. Two people have had recent training.
- <sup>a</sup> **Church Use Fees**—After discussion, Sue moved that "church use fees (funerals, weddings, etc.) be applied to Debt Retirement." **(M/S/A)**
- Snow Removal Bids—A range of bids were reviewed. A number of factors are involved. Rex will discuss variables with current provider.
- Annual Meeting Reports —Due January 9<sup>th</sup>
- <sup>a</sup> Active Shooter Information—Rosemary is pursuing "active shooter on premises" actions that CLF may need.
- 2019 Budget The Finance Committee submitted the ongoing budget projections for 2018 and projected budget income and expenses for 2019. The Council then reviewed and approved projected expense changes, adjusted the 2019 budget income projections based on latest stewardship information, and selected recommendations for one-time use of funds for 2019 to submit to the Congregation for approval at the annual meeting. After discussion, Brad moved, it was seconded, and council approved that "a standard benchmark of the 12-month CPI trailing of the Midwest Region CPI-U be used, understanding that a given year may require changes." (M/S/A) Sue moved, it was seconded, and council approved that "1.4% CPI COLA be used for staff increases this coming year." (M/S/A) Paul moved, it was seconded, and council approved that 1.4% COLA also be used for current ongoing mission projects. (M/S/A)


