

REFLECTIONS FROM PASTOR PAM



"This is the beginning of an exciting – and busy – 12 months for me! Many of you know this already, but I have been asked by the synod to serve as an Internship Supervisor for Vicar Alisha Ungs. Vicar Alisha will be serving as the pastoral intern at Trinity Lutheran and United Church (UCC and Methodist), both in Edgemont, for the next 12 months.



Sunday, June 27th was her first Sunday in worship at both congregations, and I was excited to be there with her to welcome her and meet the members of each congregation. Thank you, Phil, for filling in for me here at CLF! I am sorry I missed the W/ELCA Auction of Talents that day, though!

This is a wonderful opportunity for me to help Vicar Alisha grow into the pastor she has been called to be. I had such a wonderful relationship and experience with my internship

supervisor, and I am excited to be that for Vicar Alisha. I will be meeting with her weekly in our supervisor sessions as we talk about what it means to be a pastor and all that is involved. We will work together to help her grow theologically and help her grow into her pastoral identity.

I will spend some time in Edgemont with her, observing occasionally as she teaches, preaches, leads worship, etc. You will have the opportunity to meet her, too, as I will have her involved, or at least experience, some of the ministries we have here at CLF that they do not have in Edgemont. I will have her preach here, too, at least once so she can have a different preaching experience.

REMEMBERING THE CHILDREN AT WOYATAN

We were able to join Woyatan Lutheran Church in Rapid City on June 21st for a service to remember the 215 children found buried at Kamloops in Canada. It was a powerful service of prayer, silence, and lighting candles in the children's memory. Pastor Pam preached about the church's complicity in the Indian Boarding School era and how we can build relationships now to repair the trauma. The drum group shared moving songs during the service as well. CLF was well represented with at least 15 members attending this powerful service.

PARISH NURSE UPDATE

Now that it is summer, (tourist season) it is even more important to get the COVID vaccine. The latest news is the "Delta" variant, is much more transmissible and is causing serious



illness even more now in our young people. The vaccine has been authorized for the young now and so it is time to be responsible & get your kids protected. Please do it for yourself, your family and your community. I read an interesting article about how your diet can improve brain health. Of course I find this an important subject, as I forget names of people & things more and more often. I lost my father to Alzheimer's disease at a fairly young age of 72. He lived for 10 years with it and so I am more keenly aware of symptoms and the devastation it causes. What are the best foods in your diet to improve chances of fighting off Alzheimer's and other dementia? According to studies, a diet that includes berries, apples and black or green tea (flavonoids), reduced the rate of getting a dementia related disease 2-4 times less. You also don't have to eat these foods in large quantities, just a small handful of berries every few days will do the trick. These types of foods also decrease inflammation in the body, and will reduce chances of heart disease, diabetes, cancer and other inflammatory diseases. It's a "smart" idea!

MENTAL HEALTH NEWS

I am reflecting on the losses we have all gone through. Today I am narrowing this to loss of loved ones. It is never easy and especially if unexpected, feels like a gut punch. How can we recover from these losses? There is no simple answer or "right" way to do it. When we suffer loss we can expect anger, denial and guilt among other feelings. We try to rationalize how it could have been prevented, or find someone or something to blame. Often we place that blame on ourselves. There is no fixed time line you must follow, to be sure, it can take a long time. Talking with other trusted family members or friends, a religious leader or counselor will help lighten that load some. In time your happy memories you shared with the person you lost, will begin to ease some of the pain. Many times the pain will never go away, and that is okay, as long as you continue to take care of your emotional and physical needs. If you need a caring, nonjudgmental person to help you, give me a call. Healthy mind, healthy soul!



PASTOR'S DISCRETIONARY FUND


LYNN'S RECEIPTS

How to turn a financial obligation into an opportunity Investing in our Youth

Custer Lutheran Fellowship has a long history of investing in programs to nurture Custer area youth on their faith journeys. The Church Council has heard and whole heartedly supports the desire expressed by many members to reinstate additional staffing support for our youth programs.

This mission focus comes with two challenges:

- + How will we find the right person for the position?
- + How can we feel confident we can raise adequate ongoing funds to pay for additional staff?

Personnel: Prayer and a diligent search process will be needed to find the right person for this part time lay youth leadership position. The council feels strongly we should be patient searching for the right person, but we should start searching sooner rather than later.

Funding: Our current mortgage balloons in December of 2022. Leading up to that point we can pay down as much of the mortgage as we are able with no penalties which reduces our interest expense. When the balloon matures, we will probably owe about \$140,000, with payments of \$38,800 per year for another 4 years. If we could raise enough funds to pay down that mortgage to less than \$100,000, CLF could refinance through the ELCA Mission Investment Fund with up to a 10 year personal loan (no mortgage on the building, no closing costs for switching and a fixed rate that looks like it would be similar to what we could get with our current lender). The debt service for this fixed rate personal loan would lower annual debt service by about \$20,000 a year LESS than our current payment and would pay off the loan within 6 years. This decrease in ongoing expenses would get us to where we need to be to fund the youth leadership position.

More information on ideas for this capital fund opportunity will be sent out with the Semi-annual giving statements in July.

In the meantime the council needs your input.

What do you think of this strategy? Do you have other ideas? Should the council include it in the next budget?

Would you be willing to join a giving circle that would provide a match for funds pledged by the congregation? We have already heard from several members who would be interested. Let the Finance Secretary, Ann Snow, know if you are interested. Like your normal contributions, all donations at CLF are confidential and the council and pastor would prefer to remain uninformed regarding who has made pledges.

IMPRESSIONS OF THE 2021 SOUTH DAKOTA SYNOD GATHERING From Li Fjerestad

This year's Zoom SD SYNOD GATHERING was inspiring and interesting. The main topic was "Journeying Together in Christ with Neighbors in Solidarity" and was based on the parable of the Good Samaritan with the question: 'Who is my neighbor'. We have an inspiring Bishop who talked eloquently of the characters: the beaten man, the rabbi or priest, the inn-keeper and the man who acted as neighbor to the half-dead man. She also talked of context points as characters: the dangerous road, the bad stretch of barren land it was on, the disappearing robbers. She took us into a broader understanding of a story we all know and cherish from the Bible.

Willett Capers, an Augustana staff member, spoke to the Good Samaritan parable by discussing some defining characteristics of a good neighbor in a contemporary context: the one who listens to us, believes our experience, doesn't negate us, and apologizes if they got it wrong the first time. As we embrace differences while creating belonging, she reminds us that knowledge is power (so learn), connect with others, embrace the difficult conversations (lean in), and 'look for the helpers'. When Fred Rogers was small and he was frightened by things happening in the world, his mother would tell him to 'look for the helpers'. Good advise from any mother. Willette shared with us what a positive influence Fred Rogers Neighborhood had on her as a child. She asked us to think about the value of having a diverse community, how power and privilege effects you as an individual and to also look inward. For example, inward to the place of kindness and inclusion we hear when Fred Rogers says, 'I want YOU as a neighbor. Can you be my neighbor?'

As Bishop said of this year's Mission Plan: 'God speaks in every language of the heart'. I was interested in the faith testimony of Jon Old Horse (pastor at Woyatan in North Rapid City) and hope we can see this video at CLF. I was encouraged that the Bishop is willing to speak up on behalf of healthcare justice for over 45,000 of the poorest adult residents in SD and ND. I look forward to finding out more about 'Justice: a re-structuring video, and the Synod's Justice Table on Indigenous Peoples.In conclusion, I am so humbled and happy to be a member of SD SYNOD. As Pastor Amy put it: 'It's about simplicity and the profound love of God'.

COUNCIL MINUTES – JUNE 15TH, 2021 MEETING

Treasurer's and Finance Committee's Report: The year to date offering is 12% over budget. May expenditures were over monthly budget and are 3% of budget year to date.
