PONDERINGS FROM PASTOR

Have you ever wondered on Sunday morning when you get up to get ready to go to church why you are going? I think if you are really honest, you will answer yes, or at least you will say maybe you did when you were younger. I will tell you that the question has crossed my mind more than once. So I'm curious, why do you worship? My guess is that there are a variety of reasons. My hope is that it its because you deepen your faith and hope by gathering with other Christians regularly to be fed and nourished by God's Word and through the Sacraments.



Several years ago, I read a book that was written in 1999 by the author and theologian, Marva Dawn, titled A Royal Waste of Time: The Splendor of Worshiping God and Being Church for the World. In her opening paragraphs she writes, "To worship the Lord is—in the world's eyes—a waste of time. It is indeed, a *royal*, of time, but a waste of time nonetheless. By engaging in it we don't accomplish anything useful in our society's terms...Worship is a *royal* waste of time, but indeed it is *royal*, for it immerses us in the regular splendor of the King of the cosmos." She goes on to address the real waste of time that we as Christians have spent arguing about how and when and what to include as worship. She doesn't suggest throwing out tradition or sticking strictly to tradition. She suggests examining why we are there in a deep and meaningful way. While this book is nearly 25 years old, I have decided to pull it off my shelf and dust it off and re-read it. I would like to invite you to possibly join me in a book study this summer. If you order it now and take a month or so to read, highlight it, take notes on it, then at the end of summer we can meet for coffee or breakfast or something to discuss it for a couple of hours. I will determine when or where we will meet once I know how many people will join me. If you want me to order the book for you, please let me know by July 9th.

Speaking of worship, the worship and music committee is very committed to making sure you do have a meaningful worship experience. We are trying a rhythm of worship that includes traditional Lutheran Liturgy on the first Sunday of every month and a less traditional possible more contemporary service on the third or fourth Sunday. The other Sundays will be an abbreviated Liturgy with a mix of traditional and contemporary music and liturgy.

MENTAL HEALTH NEWS

What is Major Depressive Disorder? It's not just a sadness, but a state of mind. It can be characterized by changes in activity, sleep disturbances, difficulty concentrating, hopelessness, mood swings, lack of energy and suicidal thoughts. It is more often not a one-time event but is recurrent. What causes it? It can be caused by a trauma event, history of depression in family, drug or alcohol abuse and some health issues. There are a number of ways to treat this disorder. There are a medications and often times it can take some trial and error to find one that will help. There is also talk therapies, including one-on-one and group, electroconvulsive therapy and a combination of therapies. Can it get better? Yes, but it may require lifelong therapy. Nearly one in 10 people will be diagnosed with Major Depression. Years ago they typically called it a "nervous breakdown". If this sounds like you or someone you love, seek help. You can begin with your Primary Care Provider".

LITTLE-KNOWN AID PROGRAM AVAILABLE FOR CERTAIN LOW-INCOME SOUTH DAKOTANS

Our friends from Bread for the World—South Dakota shared the following information with us about an aid program that low-income members of your worshiping communities might be eligible for:

There is still time to help certain low-income people sign up for the South Dakota's little -known tax refund program called "Sales or Property Tax Refund Program for Senior Citizens and Citizens with Disabilities." The sign-up period is only May-June, with a July 1 deadline.

The program has these income limits (which were just raised by the legislature): One-person household: \$14,949; two-persons: \$20,141.

You can find more information from the state here, (https://dor.sd.gov/newsroom/salesand-property-tax-refund-program-for-senior-citizens-and-citizens-with-disabilities/? mc cid=f35ea9fb3c&mc eid=4ed6372cd1) including a link to a packet with two applications (which may look like it is for 2022, but it's 2023). Applications for the refund should also be available at your county treasurer's office.

According to Bread for the World — South Dakota, those who participated in the program last year received an average of \$200, an amount which can be a big help for those eligible for the program. If you have questions, you can find contact information to the relevant office of the South Dakota Department of Revenue by following the link above.
