PARISH NURSE NOTES BY MARY KLEIN, RN PARISH NURSE

I know I am not alone in wondering where summer went! Hope we all got out and had some fun! The topic I want to cover is **Atrial Fibrillation**. I am using information from the Mayo Clinic. More than 3 million Americans live with atrial fibrillation.



What does this mean? Our heart has four chambers, the upper are called atria and the lower ones are ventricles. The atria has altered electrical activity which causes the upper chambers to beat very fast and irregular. The atria "quiver" and thus do not pump blood through the heart effectively. This erratic behavior can cause blood clots to form, possibly breaking loose and traveling to the brain. When this happens it can cause a stroke. Atrial fibrillation can also cause the heart to be overworked and stressed leading to new heart failure or worsening of existing heart failure.

Common symptoms include lightheadedness, heart palpitations, fatigue, and shortness of breath, chest discomfort or confusion. It may last for minutes or hours and then go away or become intermittent triggered by emotional or physical stress. Sometimes you are not even aware of it until a check-up or after a stroke, so it's important to have regular checkups.

What are the risk factors that put you at higher risk? As we age the electrical & structural properties of the atria may change, which can lead to the breakdown of your usual heart rhythm. Other preexisting conditions include; obesity, high cholesterol, sleep apnea, high blood pressure, diabetes, smoking and alcohol overuse.

What can be effective treatments? Lifestyle changes is a big factor by losing weight, getting more exercise, getting treatment for sleep apnea and high blood pressure, quitting smoking and reducing alcohol intake. Another important treatment is anticoagulants. These medications reduce the risk for blood clots, reducing the risk of stroke. Another important treatment aims at restoring a regular heart rhythm. Sometimes this can be done by medications (chemical cardioversion) or by using an electrical shock, "electrical cardioversion" to restore a regular rhythm. Another option may require a procedure which involves inserting a catheter into the interior of the heart for an "ablation". The catheter tip burns the specific are of the heart that is causing it to misfire. Another needed treatment may be inserting a pacemaker to maintain a regular rhythm. Healthy body

MENTAL HEALTH UPDATE BY MARY KLEIN, RN PARISH NURSE

Mental Health challenges can be complex and requires professional care for months, even years. Since the pandemic, just like everything else, mental health has been greatly affected. Getting care can also be challenging as Mental Health Professionals have been very busy with many having a backlog of clients. One good thing did come out of the pandemic, not all visits need to be in person. The initial visit(s) should be in person, but once things stabilize, talk with your provider about the possibility of an online visit, where you can still see each other. This makes it much easier on the Provider as well as the client. This also helps to streamline the process and ease the backlog. Another new option being discussed is what they call a "single-session intervention". It takes a "less is more" approach to the time spent with the professional and focuses on teaching effective strategies to help you navigate your mental health challenges. This approach will hopefully get more help out to more people in a shorter period of time. They are still doing some studies on this method and remember this is not for everyone. Stay safe.

COUNCIL MINUTES — August 22, 2023

Secretary's Report: The correspondence was reviewed. There was consensus and the minutes for the July meeting were approved. Worship attendance records were reviewed.

Treasurer's and Finance Committee's Report: The offerings thru July were 120% of budget (\$4,729) and YTD remains above budget by 109% (\$14,833). Expenses were 101% of budget (\$1,538) due to paying third quarter business insurance bill in July.
