I know we can all feel it in the air. Spring. Isn't it lovely? Most of us are longing for that green grass to burst through the brown, cold earth. But here we are, still in Lent. The New Life of Spring, and of the Resurrection is just around the corner. Just not yet. Isn't that how life is when we are waiting for something good to happen, but we can't rush it no matter how hard we try. I was told a few months ago that there are brake people and gas pedal people. People who take things a little more slowly and patiently, and people who like to put the pedal to the metal! When I am driving, I am a "stick to the speed limit" girl, but in life, I am a gas pedal person. When something good is on the horizon, I don't like to wait! During these last few weeks of Lent, I would like to encourage all of us to savor this time of reflection. Our mid-week Lenten services with the theme Bread of Life have been so meaningful. We have learned new prayer practices, new songs, and hopefully even made some new friends. Like most things, learning to do new things also takes time. As we contemplate what is next in our lives, it's important to remember that. Lately if feels like the world is moving at a pace faster than ever, even for me who is a gas pedal person. My new learning during Lent is to take more pauses, pay attention more the what is happening right in front of me. Watching and waiting for what good things are on the horizon rather than trying to run to the edge of the earth to get there first.

God willing there will be green grass very soon, and all those plants that have been staying warm under the earth will be pushing there way through soon enough. In a few weeks, we will celebrate the Resurrection of Jesus, but for now, we imagine him in the wilderness preparing for his journey to the cross. Give yourself permission not to rush through this time. We still have Holy Week to reach in order to fully embrace the sacrifice Jesus made for our sake. How will you savor this remaining time of Lent? Praying more, studying more, sitting with friends a little longer? Young and old alike have participated in retreats, activities, horse-back rides, hikes and adventures at their amazing facility. As we all know, over time the facilities take a lot of wear and tear. One of the buildings that is the home for the female counselors during summer camp, Day Spring is the name of the building, is ready for some renovation. As a Thank Offering for 60 years of ministry partnership, CLF is going to help Raise the Roof and Renovate Day Spring. 
RAP YOUTH GROUP


WORSHIP AND NOISY OFFERING

Pine Ridge Diaper Drive:

Diapers are as essential to a child's basic needs as food and shelter—yet state and federal programs do not offer special funding for those in need.

Humane Society—Custer:

- + Dry dog food: Purina, or other name brand,
- + Dry cat food: Purina or other name brand
- + Monetary donations to assist with bills, etc. are helpful as well.
