PASTOR'S PONDERINGS

What is most meaningful for you during worship? That's a very personal question, with a variety of answers. For some of you, it's the view out the windows, for some it is the music, for others it is the sermon, and for some it is the quiet time of prayer. The list goes on. For decades pastors and worship planners have debated what to do to hold people's attention, or how best to inspire people to live their lives in faith and hope, and most importantly, how to keep people coming back week after week. Some weeks,

everything will seem to flow together nicely, and other weeks, it may seem that things are disjointed and confusing. Sounds like life, doesn't it?

One thing that I want you to know for sure, is that those of us who are part of the planning for the worship service take it very seriously. We try to have a good mix of traditional liturgy and music along with new and/or more contemporary songs and settings. When I preach, you may notice that sometimes I stand behind the lectern, and others I move about a bit. These choices are intentional in that I want the worship experience to be mean-ingful and impactful to a broad range of people, personalities, and attention spans. Something else that I take seriously every week is my hope that you hear the Good News of the Grace of God woven throughout every element of the service.

An important thing to know about Lutheran Church services and the reason we have a liturgy—prayers and litanies where the congregation speaks alternately with the worship leader—is that worship is supposed to be engaging for your mind, body, and spirit. We stand up and sit down in order to engage your body. We pray silently and with the others out loud to engage our minds and spirits. We sing and make a joyful noise to engage with our senses and to hear each other worship.

Now the next question, or thought to ponder, is what is the worshippers responsibility during the service? My hope is that you come with an open mind and heart to actively listen, learn, and grow each week. Worship is not meant to be an entirely passive experience where you just come and sit and go through the motions and prayers on auto-pilot. The more you put into it personally, I'm convinced, the more you will get out of it! I truly appreciate feedback, and would love to hear your suggestions and ideas!

MINISTRY

PARKINSON'S DISEASE INFORMATION

- 1. The cause is unknown and there is no cure, but there are treatments and medications that help.
- 2. There is no one treatment that fits all. Each person has different combinations in symptoms and needs calling for different combinations of treatment.
- 3. Changes in cognition, moods, fatigue, delusions, sleep disorders and sexual problems can be difficult. This calls for frequent medical attention as changes occur.
- 4. Very early changes that may be seen are inability to smell things like: dill pickles, bananas and anise. Also, handwriting may become quite small.
- 5. One important management tool is exercise, which helps mobility, balance and other every day activities.
- 6. Another Parkinson symptom is a flat or lack of facial movements to express one's self. This is because the muscles have become stiff and take longer to move leading to miss-reading reactions. It is important to listen.
- 7. The treatment of Parkinson's is a team approach with Neurological Specialists, Physical, Occupational and Mental Health Therapists and families.
- 8. There is support for individuals and families through the Parkinson's Foundation. The foundation is global in nature. Their HELP Line number is 1-800-473-4636 and is a 24 hour line that helps with questions or disease management and referrals.




LUTHERAN WORLD RELIEF – DISASTER RESPONSE

Following the example Jesus sets in the story of the Good Samaritan, Lutheran World Relief expresses faith through action, serving people in need without regard for religious affiliation. This commitment often permits Lutheran World Relief to work in areas prohibited to other church groups. It was founded in 1945 by National Lutheran Council for the purpose of providing relief to Europe after World War !! by shipping material resources that Lutheran congregations gathered.

Lutheran Disaster Response shares God's hope to those in the United States and around the world who have been struck by disaster, and the severity of the situation is more than the local, state, and national organizations can handle. Lutheran Disaster Response works with local partners, community members, and organizations to determine the appropriate response for the affected area, and that the project meets professional international standards and guidelines. 85% of donations are used directly for the projects and regular reporting on the use of funds and how it impacts the community are made to the organization. They provide short and long-term assistance.

Lutheran World Relief receives funding from individuals, congregations, and congregational groups and the three major Lutheran church bodies (NALC, LCMS, ELCA). Additional funds come from charitable foundations and from US government grants. They take stewardship and accountability seriously, and they are audited yearly by an external firm with records are made public.

When the dust settles and the headlines change, Lutheran Disaster Response stays to provide God's hope, healing and renewal with ongoing assistance to those in need.


