OUTLAW RANCH SUMMER STAFF HOST FAMILES NEEDED!

The Summer Staff at Outlaw Ranch have arrived! It has been a very long tradition of CLF to support the ministries of OR, and part of that includes supporting the amazing folks that come to serve the campers all summer. The staff begin arriving the week after Memorial Day for their two week training time. On June 8th, during worship, we will offer a special blessing and commissioning to the whole Outlaw staff. This will be a wonderful opportunity for all of us to meet and welcome them.

Would you and/or your family be willing to support two or more of these wonderful people? This is what it means to be a Host Family:

Send notes or small gifts of encouragement regularly throughout the summer. Be willing to sit with them in worship on Sundays...invite them to join you and be willing to pick them up and drop them off if they don't have their own transportation. Invite them to have a meal with you at least 3 times during the summer. Offer a weekend or two where they could maybe come and do a load or two of laundry (they do have laundry facilities, but they get pretty busy on the weekends when everyone is trying to do laundry at the same time.) If they are an international student, or have never been to the Black Hills before, be willing to take them to some of the traditional "tourist" sites or maybe even on one of your favorite hikes! Really the sky is the limit! One thing that happened last year that we'd like to avoid is that some of the staff was really showered with love from their sponsor, and some only had one or two interactions. One idea to level things out is to make the suggestion that at the beginning of the summer, the first week of June, to introduce yourself personally if possible, to be here on the day of their blessing and commissioning, June 8th during worship and fellowship, then after that try to touch base a minimum of twice a month and no more than once a week. However, it is largely up to you! Let Pastor Shannon know if you are interested and how many staff you will be willing to host. You not only will be a gift to the staff person(s) you host, you will also be very blessed by their faith and energy and willingness to work at our partner in ministry, Outlaw Ranch.

PASTOR'S PONDERINGS

Pastor's Ponderings

On June 8, the day we celebrate the Birthday of Christianity, otherwise known as Pentecost, we will hopefully all be wearing RED to symbolize the power of the Holy Spirit
blowing through our lives and showing us the love of Jesus in the whole world! This will also be the end of the year in terms of the Narrative Lectionary, the scripture schedule for Sunday Worship. I have loved spending so much time in the Gospel of Luke and then the Book of Acts and Paul's Letter to the Galatians this Winter and Spring.



This summer we will be switching things up a little bit and then we will start in September with a deep dive for 9 months into focusing on John's Gospel bookended by Old Testament Stories and New Testament Letters. For the summer, if you would like to join me in some deep Bible Study, I will be mainly focusing on two particular Books of the Bible for my sermon/preaching texts. Beginning on June 15 through July 20, we will be focusing on the Prophet Jeremiah. On July 27th, we will move into the book of Revelation. Each week there will also be a secondary Scripture from the Book of John, but the main focus for preaching and praying will be on Jeremiah and Revelation.

I'm hoping that many of you will join me in really spending some time focusing on these very rich, deeply theological, and beautifully complicated books of the Bible. If you would like to join me for an overview of these books before we begin these two series, please let me know and I will arrange a time for us to gather together some afternoon or evening at the beginning of June. However, I would encourage all of you to get those bibles and pencils ready and get a jump start on the readings! You will find the exact readings I will be focusing on the last page of this newsletter. I would encourage you to read each passage every day for the week and to do some of your own studying before the service on Sunday. Then I would love to hear your feedback regarding how the sermon, music, and worship service as a whole helped you with a deeper understanding of each week's particular Scripture readings.

Looking forward to studying the Prophet Jeremiah with you this month! Pastor Shannon

CORNERSTONE RESCUE MISSION IN RAPID CITY JUNE'S SOCIAL MINISTRY MISSION

The Cornerstone Mission started with the missionary work of Dave and Cheryl Adams in the early 1980s. They first sheltered the homeless in their own home and then created the Mission in a house at the corner of 12th and St. Joseph. The Cornerstone Mission was incorporated April 2, 1982.

Today the Cornerstone Rescue Mission is the main provider of shelter and the only ongoing and free source of meals for the homeless in the Black Hills region. The main facility houses as many as 160 homeless nightly and feeds twice that many. During the holiday season, they serve between 400 and 500.

The Cornerstone Rescue Mission strives to provide programs that will help each individual become more self-sufficient. They meet the needs of more than 500 people every day and they've impacted the lives of thousands over the years. Many have gone on to lead fulfilling, independent lives and contribute to the community.

The Cornerstone Mission is privately funded, nondenominational, and a 501©3 tax-exempt organization. More than 80% of their annual support comes from individual donors with the rest from churches, businesses, civic organizations, foundations, and other grant-making organizations

For less than \$25 a day, the Mission can provide three meals, clothing, shelter, case management, transportation to and from jobs, providing for personal needs items, and Biblical counseling. Your contribution can significantly impact the lives of those in need.

Clean ceiling lights in Fireside Hallway (flies, etc.) and the hallway windows.

Patch the parking lot with bagged asphalt (already purchased).

Sidewalk lights to Growing Root/Down Under (2 are out and unable to loosen the fasteners to access bulbs. Bring ass't screwdrivers Outdoor Ministry Area – (TBDone before June 6/14) Saw up and dispose of 3 rotten utility poles in the west/grassy parking lot. 2-3 others are in good shape, so could be used elsewhere; Purchase and grade 4 loads(?) of gravel @\$50/load w/CLF business card for billing address; install drain dips to slope towards parsonage side.
