As I write this, I'm still in the glow of the joy, and the exhaustion, of our wonderful celebration of our 60th anniversary celebration! The feeling that I had over and over again during the planning and during the event was incredible deep gratitude. I have known since the day I began serving CLF that I was joining something really special, but in learning more about the history of CLF and dreaming about the future, my love for this congregation grew even more.

I recently finished a book called <u>The Serviceberry</u> by Robin Wall Kimmerer. As I was reading I kept thinking about the community that CLF has intentionally become. The main theme of the book is what I would call the economy of gratitude. The author talks about how the earth is naturally designed to be abundant for the sake of all creatures. The Serviceberry, also known as the Juneberry, produces a very sweet nutritious berry for the birds and the birds in return help to distribute the seeds so the tree/bush can stay in production. It's basically a book paying homage to the food chain and natural life cycles in creation. She then explores the question of the possibility of humans living in such an economy.

While I was reading, I kept thinking that this is what CLF strives to do with all of the gifts we have collectively. Each and every one of you is a gift to the community and over and over again the gifts you share bring back an abundance of gifts into our ministries. The cycle of giving and receiving for the sake of the health of our community and world in Jesus' name is a beautiful thing.

The outpouring of generosity during the planning and celebrating our 60 years of ministry and partnership with Outlaw Ranch was truly incredible. Do you realize that in less than 6 months because of your enthusiasm and generosity nearly 125 people gathered in person to celebrate?! The gift that was grown is \$120,000. This give will be shared with Outlaw Ranch! While \$60,000 of that came from the Nesheim family, the remaining \$60k came from all of you. The fruits of this generosity will now be shared for generations of young adult summer staff and campers who will be blessed by the ministry of their time at Outlaw. And who knows where the love and joy that they are filled with will go from there.

The even more apparent connection between the Serviceberry and CLF is that our community is built on the hope of Jesus and our commitment to share all that we are given so generously with others. The book ends with this paragraph, "Regenerative economies that reciprocate the gift are the only path forward. To replenish the possibility of mutual flourishing, for birds and berries and people, we need an economy that shares the gifts of the Earth, following the lead of our oldest teachers, the plants. They invite us all into the circle to give our human gifts in return for all we are given. How will we answer?"

Thank your for answering with such love and hope for the future of God's love poured out for all!

One week has passed since the CLF 60th Anniversary Celebration. For those able to attend or be part in any way, the enjoyment of renewing friendships, the warm fuzzy feelings about the present, and the inspiration for the future all remain in our hearts and minds. For those who were not able to join us in Custer and for those who joined us in spirit from afar, I would like to share with you reflections of each of the pieces that made our event meaningful, and some of the comments the committee has received.

We know there was great anticipation for the weekend, but most noticeable was the All Are Welcome spirit from the moment each one stepped in the front door. The narthex looked welcoming and sounded welcoming. Familiar faces, smiles, greetings, flowers, signs, and booklets. Story from Sunny Reeves. Member since 1975.

Our Mom's story about her wonderful journey with CLF began in the most unexpected way - through jury duty! As she so often says "How about that?" Mom and Dad had been members of Our Redeemer Lutheran Church in Custer for several years, where Mom served as both the organist and Release Time teacher on Wednesdays. I have memories of sitting upstairs in the organ loft watching Mom's face as she played through the hymns I remember today that filled the sanctuary. When their minister was transferred and replaced with someone whose style which didn't quite match our family's spiritual needs, Mom and Dad found themselves searching for a new church home.

Then came June 1975 - what a whirlwind month that was! Mom and Dad had just purchased their ranch on Carroll Creek Road and were excitedly packing up their life from 4 Mile Road when Mom received a jury duty summons. Not only was she selected for the jury, but it was a sequestered jury - an adventure she never expected!

While Dad, my sister, and I continued the exciting move to the ranch, Mom packed her bags for what would become a lifechanging week...and then two weeks...and then month. Her assigned roommate was Jane Olson, and what a blessing that pairing turned out to be! After days of being confined to the courthouse and hotel, both were feeling restless. When Jane suggested they ask permission to attend church together, Mom eagerly agreed. Jane introduced our Mom to Custer Lutheran Fellowship, and from that very first Sunday, Mom knew she had found her spiritual home.

That chance meeting with Jane blossomed into a 40-year partnership teaching Confirmation Classes together. They became the dynamic duo that guided countless young people through their faith journey from 1975 to the early 2000s. Mom has great stories about all the kids who grew up, got married, and brought their own children to CLF. She and Jane created such a welcoming environment that made learning about faith feel like an adventure rather than a chore.

Mom has watched CLF grow and flourish over the decades - from the single room where everyone gathered, to the addition of the beautiful reception hall on the west side, and through all the wonderful expansions that created the magnificent building that stands today. Each addition represented not just physical growth, but the expanding heart of a community that welcomed everyone with open arms.

The relationships Mom built at CLF became the cornerstone of her happiness. Whether she was serving communion, bringing comfort to members who couldn't attend services, enthusiastically teaching Confirmation Classes, or joyfully "banging the drum and singing in the Praise Band" (as she loves to say), she found her purpose in serving this incredible community.

Dad, who worked for the Forest Service, discovered that many of his colleagues were also CLF members, which created wonderful connections between work and worship. The Reeves family was embraced by an amazing network of people who didn't just attend church together - they became extended family, celebrating life's joys and supporting each other through challenges. One of Mom's most treasured traditions was her weekly lunches with a group of dear friends, many of whom she's known for over 60 years now! These spirited ladies would gather to discuss everything under the sun - from politics to parenting, from faith to furry pets, and everything in between. The laughter that filled those lunch meetings was infectious, and these friendships became some of Mom's most precious gifts.

Even though Mom moved to Heritage Assisted Living in Rapid City in 2023, her heart remains connected to CLF. She eagerly follows the CLF Facebook page, delighting in seeing familiar faces and staying updated on all the happenings. When friends call or visit, she loves to catch up on the latest news from her church family including the Monthly Newsletter.

Mom's journey with Custer Lutheran Fellowship has been filled with joy, friendship, service, and countless blessings. She often reflects on how that unexpected jury duty assignment led her to exactly where she was meant to be. Her message to the current CLF community is simple but heartfelt: "Treasure these relationships and this special place. The love and fellowship you share will carry you through life's journey with joy and purpose."

As CLF celebrates its 60th Anniversary, Mom sends her love and warmest congratulations to everyone who continues to make this church family such a beacon of hope and happiness in the community. Her story is just one of countless tales of lives transformed and hearts filled through the welcoming spirit of Custer Lutheran Fellowship.
