- We will also be writing cards/letters to military, college students and home-bound/nursing home congregants. Pastor Shannon will be providing a special blessing of the cards prior to their mailing.

BASEMENT DRAINAGE PROJECT COMPLETED

The basement drainage project is completed! CLF folks may recall that following major thunderstorms water has been leaking into the church basement beneath the steps and onto the hall and some storage room floors. After considerable study it was decided to increase lawn slope away from the building, remove siding, add a water barrier to the wall, install "Versetta Stone" cultured rock and small retaining walls, and finish it off with new sod and border rock. It has stormed three times since completion and there is no water issue, and the project looks great. A team of 17 volunteers spent about 315 hours carving out time from vacations, home projects, and family to get this important property stewardship project completed. The final cost is around \$10,724.42 with a bill or so left to come in. What is not reported is the hours of conversation and relationships fostered while accomplishing the project. That is a foundation of Custer Lutheran Fellowship.

For those of you who were able to worship regularly this summer, I sincerely pray that you found the studying of the Books of Jeremiah and Revelation illuminating and inspiring. As we move into a new season of the year, we will be jumping back into the Narrative Lectionary. The pattern of scripture readings for September until the middle of December we will be hearing readings from the Old Testament, beginning with Genesis, and moving through the prophets until we begin Advent. Each week there will be a supplemental reading from the Gospel of John, or from the Book of Psalms. My main preaching focus will be on the Old Testament readings. The schedule of readings will be printed in this Newsletter if you are interested in staying ahead of the readings. I would love it if I saw many of you with your Bibles or the pew Bibles opened while we are hearing certain passages!

With school beginning, it is a good time to be reminded of our invitation to keep learning, to keep building our knowledge base, and to keep experiencing the growth that comes with studying the bible together. I have had many people express an interest in having more opportunities to connect what they are learning from the bible with real world happenings. In response to this interest, we are going to begin having regular adult forums. I will be inviting others to help lead the conversations on topics they feel well educated in. We have many people in our congregation with much depth in many topics. If you have a current conversation topic that you are well versed in, please let me know if you would be willing to facilitate a conversation about it. We will be using both the Bible and the ELCA social statements to support our learning and conversation. Our first Adult Forum will be after worship on Sept. 21st in the fireside room and the topic will be Education. We will mostly focus on the role of parents and mentors in faith formation, but will also talk about the ELCA commitment to public education. I thought this would be a great jumping off topic since all of our educational programming begins this month! There will be a sign-up sheet on the Welcome Center, all are welcome! 
