BUILDING AND PROPERTY CHANGES FOR INSURANCE PURPOSES: Locks and Keys

Across the country insurance premiums for almost everything are rising, and our property insurance for CLF is definitely impacted. For the second year in a row, we were told that our insurance was being dropped for reasons out of our control, and thankfully we were able to find a company that would carry us. Our new carrier came and did an assessment of our property and gave us quite a list of things that we are required to do in order to keep our insurance policy current. The estimated cost of all of the improvements will be nearly \$45,000. Fortunately, we won't have to pay for it all in 2025, as some of the contractors will be able to split the payments between 2025 and 2026. With these updates will come a few changes to our building. One of the changes has to do with the keys and security of our building. Because there has not been a list that has been kept current of key holders to the church, we are getting all new locks on the exterior doors. There will be a master key that will be kept in the office and that the Pastor, Office Manager, and Property Manager will have. There will be a keys for the exterior Office Door that will be made and given to key leaders of the church and community who frequently enter when the office is closed, as well as a key to check out for people who only need it for special circumstances. The door that has a code will be converted to a key lock. The work on these locks will begin this month. The office door will always be open during office hours, but the other doors will remain locked unless there is a special activity happening. It may take some time to remember, but please start the practice of entering the church during the week from the office door.

The list of projects that are currently in the process of being updated for insurance purposes include:

- Replacement of all of the sprinkler heads
- Re-keying all exterior doors
- Placing water sensors beneath the boilers and water heaters
- Adding 12 inches of mulch underneath the playground equipment
- Replacing the wood stove in the parsonage
- Placing carbon monoxide sensors in the areas where people could potentially sleep (down under, Sunday school rooms, parsonage)

This is a small way that we can give back to you, and to show our appreciation for being part of the CLF family.

My prayer is that together, we can shift our focus from the stressful pace of the holidays, to the joyful reality of the many gifts that God showers us with. The best gift of all is the Love or God that brings us together each week to gather Jesus' table of Grace! Thanks be to God!

LEFSE MAKING

Please join in the fun on November 22, at 9:00, to make Lefse! We are planning to make lots of Lefse to sell the next day at our Craft and Goodie Sale after services. Proceeds will be donated to local missions. If it is too crowded in the kitchen, we plan to set up tables in the fellowship hall. Bring your Lefse dough, rolling pins, electric griddle, etc. If you don't have experience, we would love for you to come anyway and help wherever you can. Once the Lefse has cooled, we will fold and package them to sell. There are many recipes, but here is one that works well:

Lefse

5 pounds Russet potatoes

1/4 cup butter, room temperature

1/4 cup heavy cream

1 tablespoon white sugar

2 Teaspoon salt

1 cup of flour per 2 cups of potatoes

Boil the potatoes until tender and drain. Put potatoes through a "ricer" twice. Mix in butter and cream while warm. Cover with paper towels and let them cool in the refrigerator overnight.

Add sugar, salt, and flour mixing with your hands. It's best to use kitchen gloves while working. Roll into a log. Cut and measure 1/3 cup round balls. Heat the special Lefse griddle to the highest temperature 500 degrees. Cover the board and rolling pin. Using extra flour, roll until about 14". Fry until golden brown spots appear, then turn it over so both sides are golden. It only takes a minute or so. Place the Lefse rounds on paper towels or dish towels to cool. Once cool, fold them and place in a baggie or wrap in Saran Wrap.

FALL ENROLLMENT SPOTLIGHT: A PEEK INSIDE THE GROWING ROOTS CLASSROOM

We're delighted to share an update on the exciting activity happening in our program this fall! We currently have **18 bright students** exploring and learning in our dynamic environment.

Our Daily Flow

Our day begins with parents dropping off students directly in the secure outdoor play area, allowing the children to start their day with movement and fresh air. We then transition inside for our focused **morning work period**, where students engage with Montessori materials.

Around 11:00 AM, the children transition to their mid-day break, where they are responsible for key life skills: washing their own dishes and cleaning up their dining spot. before heading outside again after lunch. Half-day students are picked up at 12:00 PM, while our full-day students enjoy a peaceful nap period before returning to more work time and afternoon outdoor play, with pick-up by 5:00 PM.

Focusing on Grace, Courtesy, and Cosmos

These first months are dedicated to establishing essential **routines and procedures**, as well as the fundamental Montessori principles of **Grace and Courtesy**. These lessons play a vital role in fostering a harmonious

community. Students practice greeting peers, promoting inclusivity, and demonstrating good manners and respect—skills that serve them far beyond the classroom walls.

Academically, our students are currently immersed in a grand study of the **Solar System!** This central topic has led to exciting extensions, including hands-on explorations of **volcanoes**, **different rock types**, **and the science behind crystal creation**.

We are so grateful to be able to host this program and look forward to sharing more updates soon!

FUNDRAISING EFFORTS CONTINUE FOR SELECT-A-GIFT

After a successful raffle this summer, the Select-A-Gift Committee is continuing its efforts to raise \$25,000 in support of our program to provide Christmas gifts to the lower-income residents of Custer County. Several churches will also have drop boxes available before and after services: Custer Lutheran Fellowship, St. John the Baptist Catholic Church, Custer Community Church, and Our Redeemer Lutheran Church.
