MID-WEEK LENTEN WORSHIP SERVICES

February 18th is Ash Wednesday and will be the first night of our Lenten Journey that takes us to the Cross of Jesus. Each Wednesday evening we will gather for a meal of soup, bread, sandwiches and dessert from 5:15-5:50. Worship will begin at 6:00 and around 6:30 our middle and high school students will gather in their youth groups to discuss the service. One addition this year is that there will also be an opportunity for adults to gather during the same time as the youth to also discuss the service. Here are ways you can make this a meaningful Lent:

- Come in at 10:00 to cook soup and bread together for the evening meal.
- Help get the kitchen and fellowship hall cleaned up quickly so everyone can come to the worship service
- Provide special music
- Be a reader for the service
- Lead a small group discussion after the service
- Worship together on both Wednesdays and Sundays

We are happy to donate the entire amount toward upgrading CLF's sprinkler system, a vital project that ensures the safety and upkeep of the facilities we both call home. We are deeply grateful for the generosity of the CLF members who attended the event and donated so thoughtfully.

Growing Roots is blessed to have such a wonderful partnership with this congregation. Thank you for providing a beautiful space for our program to flourish and for standing alongside us in this effort.

Why is it important that we have children in worship? Is it important that we have children in worship? This is a question that the majority of you reading this will have strong feelings and opinions about, as do I. If you are a parent of a child between the ages of 0-18, this is not a criticism of you, it is a question that I would love to hear your perspective and then engage in conversations with you.

At Custer Lutheran Fellowship on any given Wednesday we have close to 50 children in attendance. However, they come for the meal, and maybe 10 youth stay for the Wednesday night worship service. Since we stopped having Worship on Wednesday evenings for the six weeks before we begin our mid-week Lenten Services, and have gone to the Family Learning/Intergenerational activities, we have had an average of 60 people of all ages participating. Of the 60 people staying to participate, over half of them are students. Read that again...that is over 30 children are staying for a meal and to participate in a learning activity with adults from their families and with adults who are not connected to them in any other way than the fact they are also members of CLF. This is fantastic! And yes, this is a form of worship that all the participants are engaging in together.

To those of you who bring your children regularly to worship on Sundays, I'd love to know your "why" and to those of you who don't, I'd love to know your "why not." Most Sundays we have around 3-5 children in worship and to the parents of those children, I see you. I know what it's like to wrangle children out the door and I know that you would love to have a nice day without having to rush out the door one more time during the week. To those of you who for whatever reason don't come, I'd love to know how we can help make the transition smoother and worth it.

One thing we are doing to understand and answer these questions is as a congregation we have been accepted into a cohort of other congregations in the South Dakota Synod called the Holy Playground. Within this cohort are other pastors, coaches, parents, youth leaders, and lay leaders who are invited to get into a metaphorical sandbox together and plan and learn and experiment with creative ways to make worship more accessible for families with children living at home.

I'm looking for at least two volunteers to join me in this cohort. In the next few months we will engage in zoom meetings, small groups, a retreat in April, and many discussions. During this year, we will also have the opportunity to apply for grant money to help us implement new ideas. Please let me know if you would like to be on this team and we will jump into the sandbox together!

Excited to see what a Holy Playground looks like for Custer Lutheran Fellowship!

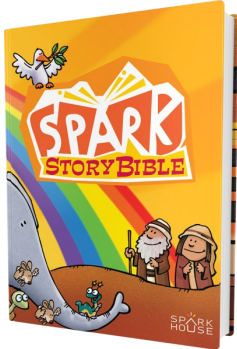
Mission of the Month

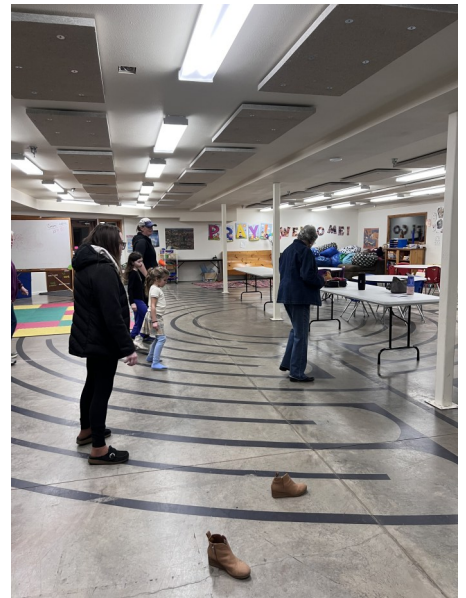

W.E.A.V.E. (Women Escaping a Violent Environment)

A very special organization in our community that has been helping women and children in need for over 20 years.

The Storehouse

Their mission is to serve people in Custer County by receiving and distributing, with respect and compassion, donated food and household items.

- ❖ Canned chicken, canned peaches, canned pears, spaghetti sauce, cereal of all kinds

Pine Ridge Diaper Drive/Sock Collection

Diapers are as essential to a child's basic needs as food and shelter—yet state and federal programs do not offer funding assistance for those in need.

- ❖ Disposable diapers, especially sizes 5 and 6 (some 1s, 2s & 4s as well). Also, adult socks are always needed

Custer Humane Society

This is a no-kill animal shelter serving Custer County. Sole support comes from private donations and fundraisers. Many of the animals are older or have health issues and will live out their lives at the shelter.

- ❖ Dry dog food, Purina, or other name brand, dry cat food, Purina or other name brand, blankets, monetary donations to assist with vet bills, etc. are needed as well.

—Thread

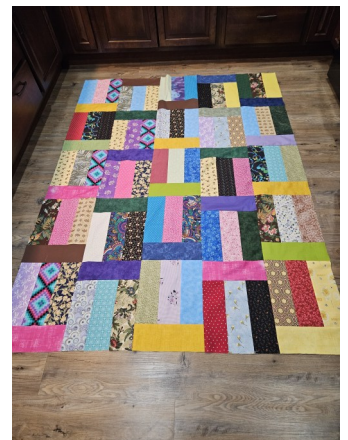
—Cotton fabric suitable for making quilts —Cotton blankets, and/or mattress pads for inside quilts.
